ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1979-80 (1-4-1979 to 31-3-1980)

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The year under report was pragmatically productive. Every unit of the Institute contributed for the furtherance of our aims and objectives.

In August 1979 the University of Mysore restored to the Institute the function of conducting the various examinations. Consequently the examinations were held well in time and the results were announced expeditiously.

The Semester system which was adopted earlier had to be given up due to many reasons. In view of this the Board of studies recommended the introduction of the non-semester system for our training programme and the same has been accept by the University.

Taking cognizance of the facilities available at the Institute for research work the University of Mysore has recognised it as a "Research Centre" for Ph.D., in Speech and Hearing Science. Three members of the teaching staff were also recognised as guides for doctoral work. The University registered the names of Mrs. Prathibha Karanth and Mrs.Vijayalaks Basavaraj for Ph.D. Miss A.D.Bhavani was registered in the Department of Clinical Psychology.

The vacant posts of Professor of Audiology, Professor of Clinical Psychology and also lecturers in Speech Pathology and Audiology were filled.

Another major event during the year was the voluntary retirement of Dr. P.R.Kulkarni, our Director on July 31, 1979.

Seven dissertations were guided, eighteen research projects were undertaken, twenty scientific papers were published apart from the nine independent projects undertaken by students under the guidance of faculty.

To meet the increasing demands for space from the Library and from the Department of Clinical Psychology new blocks for them are being constructed. The construction is under progress.

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However the completion of our Audiology and Speech Pathology Block is still limping its way towards completion. We are taking steps to speed it up. We have also taken steps to build staff quarters and to asphalt the roads on a phased basis.

The Library added 390 new books and subscribed to 59 journals.

The staff of the Electronics Laboratory were deputed to participate in an intensive course on the maintenance and servicing of electronics equipment conducted by the Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore.

The Laboratory calibrated 315 hearing aids and 9 audiometers. The Ear-Mould Laboratory manufactured 308 custom ear moulds and these were issued to the patients.

Equipment worth Rs. 3,74,914 were added to various departments.

There has been a steady increase in the case load as more number of people are becoming aware of the services of the Institute for the communicatively handicapped. A total number of 35,940 cases were examined both at the Clinic of the Institute and also at the OPD of K.R. Hospital apart from 1718 cases seen at camps in different parts of the state of Karnataka and Kerala.

On the recommendations made by the Institute, the Government of Karnataka has given Language Exemption to the deaf. Several deaf children who attended therapy at our Institute have taken advantage of this exemption and have been declared as passed in the SSLC examinations.

INTRODUCTION

The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, established this Institute in the year 1965 as a Depart ment of Government of India to shoulder the responsibility of imparting professional training, rendering clinical services to the public with Speech and Hearing disorders and also conducting research in the field. Later the Institute was converted into an autonomous body and registered under the Societ Registration Act, XXI of 1860 (Punjab Amendment) Act 1957 as extended to the Union Territory of Delhi and since then functioning under the aegies of the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. The University of Mysore accorded affiliation for teaching programme leading to the award of BSc and MSc and now Ph.D. in Speech and Hearing.

GENERAL

There are about 36 to 100 million people afflicted with Speech and Hearing problems in India., Tackling this problem is a gigantic effort which needs support and help from all quarters.

The Institute being only one of its kind in South East Asia, it has to play solitary role in the new field of Speech and Hearing, by adopting new methods through research done at the Institute by specialists, and also by bringing more qualified specialists into field such as Speech Pathologists, Audiologists, Otolaryngologists, Psychologists and Electronics Engineers.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Institute as enshrined in the Memorandum of Association are as follows:

I - Training

- (a) To provide and assist in providing general professional and technical education and training in Speech and Hearing for graduate, post-graduate and Doctorate courses of a University;
- (b) To provide and assist in providing general professional and technical education and training to various categories of personnel, e.g., Medical, Para-medical, Nonmedical, etc.;
- (c) To undertake, organise and facilitate study courses, conferences, lectures, seminars and the like to promote the above mentioned objects;
- (d) To undertake and provide for publication of journals, research papers, etc., and to establish and maintain libraries and information services in furtherance of the objects of the society;
- (e) To invite representatives of Governments, Universities and other organisations of India and of foreign countries to deliver lectures on subjects in which the society is interested;
- (f) To co-operate with international agencies engaged in speech and hearing research and training and arrange for interchange of personnel, material and data;
- (g) To institute, offer and grant prizes, awards, scholarships research grants and stipends in furtherance of the objects of the society.

II - Research

(a) To provide and assist in providing facilities and encouragement to research in speech and hearing, their disorders and the concerned diseases of ear, nose and throat

<u>IlI - Clinical Services</u>

- (a) To provide and assist in providing clinical and surgical services for those with speech and hearing handicaps and ear, nose and throat diseases;
- (b) To assist in the development of speech and hearing clinics in hospitals and other centres.

IV - Public Education

- (a) To educate the public about communicative disorders:
- (b) to stimulate interest in speech and hearing through publicity and mass communication and co-operate with other agencies and institutions or professional associations.

V - Administrative and Financial

- (a) To create administrative, technical, ministerial and other posts under the society and to make appointments thereto in accordance with the rules and regulations of the society;
- (b) to appoint and hire services or discharge/terminate the services of personnel and to pay them in return for the services, wages, gratuities, provident fund, and other allowances or remuneration in accordance with the rules and regulations of the society;
- (c) to borrow and raise money and funds to further the objects of the society and to raise or collect funds by gifts, donations, subscriptions or otherwise of cash and securities and any property either movable or immovable and to grant such rights and privileges to the donors, subscribers, and other benefactors as the society may consider fit and proper;
- (d) to invest and deal with funds and money of the Society;
- (e) to subscribe to, or become a member of or to co-operate or amalgamate with any other association or society whose objects are similar;
- (f) to sell, assign, mortgage, lease, exchange and otherwise transfer or dispose of all or any property movable or immovable, of the society for the furtherance of its objects or any of them, provided prior approval of the Central Government is obtained for any disposition of immovable property;
- (g) to negotiate and enter into contracts on behalf of the society and vary and rescind such contracts;
- (h) to accept and undertake the management of any endowment or trust fund or donation to further the objects of the society;
- (i) to establish a contributory provident fund and gratuity for the benefit of the employees of the society;

- (j) to pay all costs, charges and expenses incurred in the promotion, formation, establishment and registration of the society;
- (k) to do all such other lawful acts, deeds, things, either alone or in conjunction with other organisation or persons as the society may consider necessary, incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above mentioned objects or any of them;
- to undertake any other function that may be assigned to the society by the Ministry of Health and Family Planning (Department of Health), Government of India, in connection with speech and hearing.

LEPARTMENT OF SPEECH PATHOLOGY

The training and training programme for the undergraduate and Ph.D., students continued. Semester system was followed. As in the previous years, subjects were taught by way of lectures to undergraduate students and in the form of discussions and seminars besides lectures to port-graduate students. The subjects taught include normal development of speech, delayed speech and language, articulation, stuttering, mental retardation, cerebral palsy, aphasia, organic anamolies, voice and its disorders, cleft palate, laryngectomy, scientific enquiry and education of the aurally handicapped.

Staff

Mr. G. Purushothama was appointed as Lecturer in Speech Pathology in place of Mr. P.D. Manohar.

The departmental staff attended to clinical, diagnostic and counselling work. The students are given practical training in evaluating speech disorders, writing evaluation reports, administering and scoring standardised tests. Students train cases, write out lesson plans and progress reports under staff supervision. They are required to prepare test and therapy materials. I year BSc students observe cases trained by student therapists. All the students are required to maintain diaries and make notes of their observations.

Equipment

The department procured two new pieces of major equipment - A Pitch Computor and UHER Professional Tape Recorder. Students are given practical training in the use of equipment.

Counselling

Counselling continued as in the previous years. Staff and post-graduate students counsel parents and cases. Techniques which can be used at home are demonstrated and explained to parents. They are counselled regarding the importance of home training, vocational training and the use and care of the bearing aid. For those who cannot stay here for a longer period, demonstration therapy is arranged.

A major change in the technique of therapy which was initiated and is being tried out at the Clinic involves a greater emphasis on vowels and rhythm and intonation.

Camps

The Institute participated in speech and hearing camps in Mandya, Hiriyur, Davanagere, Calicut, Mercara, and T.Narasipur. 1483 cases were examined and guidance given regarding home training and the use of hearing aids. Several cases were referred here from the camps for detailed tests.

The following paper was presented by Dr. N.Rathna and Mr. M.G.Subramanyaiah:

"Which comes first? Articulation or Discrimination"

The purpose of this investigation was to find whether perception of sounds precedes production of sounds or vice versa during the process of speech acquisition in Kannada speaking children. The findings of this study indicated that children during the process of speech acquisition, acquire discrimination skill before they acquire articulatory skill.

The following papers were presented in the Seminar on Linguistics and Speech and Hearing at the ISHA conference. Dr. N.Rathna was the Chairman of the Seminar. 1. Autism and Language:

- Articulation and Linguistics: By G. Purushothama, Lecturer in Speech Pathology.

It deals with the scientific study of language and the contributions from phoneticians towards the understanding of the normal productions of speech sounds. The paper describes the various linguistic factors that we should consider in the rapy for articulation disorders.

3. Voice and the training of Musician:

The development of a questionnaire in Kannada to evaluate voice training in musicians. This study is being carried out.

The questionnaire consists of 75 questions on different methods of voice training which musicians undergo during learning and the methods followed to maintain vocal hygiene. The questionnaire also attempts to evaluate the rationale of the methods followed by musicians. It consists of 3 sections:

- a. For the students of music
- b. For professional musicians
- c. For music reaction

DEPARTMENT OF AUDIOLOGY

I TRAINING:

The Training program for the undergraduate and graduate students in Speech and Hearing was continued under the Semester System. An Orientation Program in collaboration with the Departments of Speech Pathology, Psychology and Otolaryngology was also conducted for a group of students from Clarke School for the Deaf, Madras, between 2nd week of December 1979 and 2nd week of January 1980.

Preparation of Non-Semester Syllabi for BSc and MSc (Speech and Hearing) Courses was undertaken, as University of Mysore has accepted our proposal to revert to the Non-Semester Scheme at both BSc and MSc level.

Noise Measuring instruments from Bharat Electronics Ltd., Bangalore, were borrowed for demonstration purposes and for training the students in the area of noise measurements. Efforts are also being made to get tape-cum-slide lecturedemonstration kit from Bruel & Kjaer, Denmark. These along with our own noise measuring kit procured during the year should make the course in noise measurement more practiceoriented.

II CLINICAL SERVICES:

Clinical services have been continued as in the previous years.

a) Hearing Evaluation:

The total number of cases seen in the Department reached 4365. Of the cases seen 789 had normal hearing, 876 had conductive hearing loss either unilateral or bilateral, 446 had mixed hearing loss either unilateral or bilateral and 1464 had either bilateral or unilateral sensorineural hearing loss.124

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cases underwent post-operative audiological evaluations, while 64 were evaluated post-patch. Special tests were administered to 178 cases, wherever necessary and whenever the instruments were working satisfactorily. 4 cases of functional hearing loss were identified. 114 cases had to be conditioned as they were either difficult-to-test or very small children. 458 infants, children below the age of $4^{1/2}$ years and some older children who could not participate in audiometry were administered with sound field tests. Clinical evaluation has provided for greater opportunities in training the students in testing varieties of cases.

The completion of the new test rooms continues to be awaited. Lack of instruments like Impedance audiometers limited the evaluations both qualitatively and quantitatively to a great extent. The evaluations done consisted mainly of pure-tone and speech testing.

As in the previous year, the clerical work and the evaluation work were increased as Government of Karnataka has announced maintenance allowance for the Physically Handicapped. As many as 235 cases came for the purpose of receiving certificates. In total, 223 certificates were issued. Out of 223, 2 belonged to Bangalore District, 1 to Chickmagalur, 3 to Coorg, 1 to Hassan, 138 to Mandya, 86 to Mysore, 1 to Shimoga and 3 to Tumkur districts. 144 were males and 91 were females. Of the 223 certificates issued, 202 were issued to people with congenital hearing loss with no speech, 5 also had other handicaps and 16 had acquired hearing loss.

b) Hearing Aids:

In total, 506 hearing aid traals were given using different hearing aids, In all those cases where hearing aid was found useful, prescriptions of suitable models and makes were provided. Separation of hearing aid trial unit, maintenance of records, etc., and recommendation slips with counterfoils were undertaken during the year for efficient service in terms of selection of hearing aids.

There were no stock of Danaid hearing aids for issue during the year. However, as and when patients returned some aids, they were issued to a few patients.

Sending follow-up letters and data collection regarding the free issue of Danaid hearing aids were undertaken. For the 130 follow-up letters sent in the year, only 3 patients replied. As the response was very poor, follow-up action has been stopped at present. However, a modified procedure to keep track of hearing aids which have been issued under Danaid Scheme is being worked out.

The completion of the forms for the issue of hearing aids on subsidy rates from the manufacturers and by the Covernment of Karnataka was undertaken. Several patients seen at the Institute have benefited from these schemes.

c) Ear Moulds:

Total number of ear moulds made were 308. 181 ear moulds were done free of cost for poor patients and 127 moulds were done on payment. 198 ear moulds were sent through post and 88 moulds were collected in person by the patients/guardians 13 moulds remained unclaimed.

Ear Mould Laboratory, as in the previous years, was used for training purposes also. VI Semester BSc and III Semester MSc students were trained in making custom ear moulds of the Standard type. 3 trainees from the Clarke School for the deaf also underwent training. Efforts are being made to start a short-term training program in ear mould making for the benefit of those who are not our trainees.

III STAFF:

As in the previous years, the staff took active part in the curricular and co-curricular activities of the Institute. Dr. S.Nikam attended meetings concerning the International Year of the Child held by the Deputy Commissioner, Mysore.

The work in the Department suffered much due to the absence of two members of staff. The appointment of two new lecturers after September 1979 came not a day too soon.

IV INSTRUMENTS:

Frequent breakdown of the audiometers and electricity presented many problems in clinical evaluation of patients as well as in the training program. Steps were taken to set righ the audiometers which broke down repeatedly. Impedance audiometers were not available for evaluation and training purposes throughout the year.

A two channel audiometer (Beltone 200C) which was received last year with its accessories missing is now complete with its spares. Three Maico audiometers which were received last year were checked. In addition, the Department also procured Tympanometer 86 AR of American Electromedics Corporation, Madsen ZO 73 Impedance meter with X-Y plotter and another Impedance audiometer from Interacoustics, Denmark. However, the new instruments which were received could not be put to use due to prevailing conditions regarding the audiometric test rooms. As soon as the new rooms are made available for use the new instruments will be put to use. These instruments in the new test rooms will increase the efficiency of clinic al evaluation and clinical training with scope for extension of the present services and renewal of projects such as school screening program.

During the year, we received Noise and Vibration Measuring Kit from Bruel & Kjaer, Denmark. This has given scope to set up a noise trauma cell, the details of which have already been placed before the Academic Sub-Committee.

V TECHNICAL CONSULTATIONS:

Technical consultations have been given whenever they were called for from hearing aid and audiometer manufacturers in India. Consultations mainly emphasise the need for better quality and low cost hearing aids and better audiometers.

VI CORRESPONDENCE:

The number of letters despatched this year numbered 323. This is slightly lower than the past year.

The screening programs were attended by Dr. S.Nikam at Certified Girls High, School, Mysore and State Home for Women, Mysore, screening 160 and 75 cases respectively for their hearing problems.

A screening program for the 20 inmates of Shishupalana Rendra, Myscre, and a camp at which 48 cases were examined at Ponnampet were attended by Mr. P.J.Kumar during the year.

X IV OTHER SERVICES:

- 1) Collected technical information and purpose of technical equipment for the expansion of services.
- 2) Efforts are being made to procure a separate unit for Pediatric Audiology and to adopt more sophisticated hearing evaluation procedures. These would have to await the completion of the new test rooms.

DEPARTMENT OF CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY

TRAINING:

The staff continued their participation in the teaching/ training of the BSc & MSc Speech & Hearing Students. Somester Scheme continued. In addition to this the participation of the staff in Orientation Courses undertaken by the Institute for the other specialities like ENT etc., were carried out.

II DIAGNOSTICS:

A total number of 1626 cases were seen for testing and evaluation in the department, 280 mentally retarded cases have been evaluated during the year. From Dec. 1979 Financial Assistance Scheme has been introduced by State Government for mentally handicapped. Our Institute is one of the two Centres recognised by the State Government of Karnataka. The staff had additional load of work for the assessment, and for issuing Certificates for the mentally retarded cases. A total of 61 certificates were issued. This work domanded detailed investigations which consumed a lot of time. As a result the work load increased indicating the dire need of more staff in the department. Case history taking and testing of the cases is being done by the Clinical Assistant of the Department and Miss. A.D.Bhavari is continued to be incharge of the diagnostics and supervision of the students.

III ADMINISTRATION:

The Department of Tsychology has been redesignated as Department of Clinical Tsychology. Accordingly, the respective staff have been redesignated as Trofessor/Reader/Lecturer in Clinical Psychology. Dr. J.Bharath Raj who was formerly Reader in the Department after being appointed has taken over charge as Trofessor and Head of the Department of Clinical Dsychology. Miss A.D.Bhavani continued as Lecturer in Clinical Psychology. The vacant post of Reader in Clinical Tsychology has been advertised and is in the process of being filled up. The staff participated in the Teaching/Training/Clinical Service of the Institute. Dr. J.Bharath Raj was in charge of Journal Club and Clinical Conference organisations. He was appointed as a Member of the Board of Studies of the Department of Tsycho logy at University of Mysore. He continued as a Member of Board of Studies in Speech & Hearing.

IV THERAPY SUPERVISION:

34 Cases were under the supervision of Dr. J. Bharath Ra 9 cases were being supervised by Miss, A.D.Bhavani. Apart from this the staff gave therapy to cases presenting special problem

Hindu University which was attended by the Staff and the students of the Institute. He also demonstrated some of the theraputic techniques on actual cases. This was very useful a the information/demonstrations helped in the day to day clinical services at the Institute.

VII EQUIPMENT:

Equipment/Material useful from the point of view of sharpening the psychological functioning skills of children and elevating their levels of intellectual functioning have been added to the department under the IQ + program.

A new instrument, "IsychoGalvanic Skin Response" useful in measuring anxiety has been added to the Department.

A number of educational films of diagnostic and therapeutivalue have been added to the Department.

Clearance has been made for procuring the sophisticated therapeutic instrument, namely, Relaxometer and voice-lite and these are shortly being added to the Department.

VIII PUBLICATION:

An article with a title "Speech, Hearing and Transcender Meditation" was published by Dr. J.Bharath Raj in "Psycho Care News", January-March, 1980. Research Projects undertaken by Mr. J.Bharath Raj:

A research project to identify malingerers from true hearing loss cases has been undertaken and data are being collected.

DE ARTMENT OF OTOLARYNGOLOGY

The objectives of this Department in collaboration with other sister departments are :

I TEACHING:

- a) To participate in training programme of BSc and MSc students. To teach them the basic knowledge of Anatomy and Thysiology pertaining to speech and hearing problems, and its application in diseases, thus providing a firm knowledge in their speciality.
- b) Birm knowledge of practical training is given to the students of MSc and BSc by Microscopic demonstrations, Audio-visual demonstrations.

II CLINICAL SERVICES:

The Department has a well-equipped clinic and services were made available to all patients attending the Institute except on Mondays and Thursdays (forenoons) which are operation days.

The collaboration with K.R.Hospital, Mysrc, continued with one Out-patients Day on Wedtesdays and two operation days on Mondays and Thursdays per week. The cases needing specialised surgery for the relief of speech and hearing problems registered at the Institute as on 31-1-1980 stood at 333 which requires additional days of operation and additional staff to help the handicaps.

The load of out-patients and of surgery is not manageable with the existing staff and physical facilities at present available. On the retirement of Dr. T.R.Kulkarni, the Department has lost an eminent ENT Specialist. Some of the specialised Extensive Surgeries have not been undertaken for want of Anaesthetic gas and O.T.problems. The reputation of the Institute has grown high on account of the excellent cooperation of the other sister departments in the field. diagnostics surgery and attention given towards curative aspects, specially surgical aspect, being provided by the qualified staff, for the restoration of voice and Hearing improvement.

Micro-otological operations such as Stapedectomy, Myringoplasty, Tympanoplasty and Maxillo-facial surgeries such as Palatoplasty and Pharyngoplasty were done this year also.

Some more equipment like Electro-Nystamography in the diagnostic fields, the Microlaryngeal and Micro-otological instruments in the curative aspects of disease have been procured for the department apart from the sophisticated anaesthetic equipment like Flutec Machine for the smooth induction of larynge surgery.

Bacteriological studies regarding the causative factors for defective hearing are being undertaken.

Alexander Graham Bell's birth anniversary was celebrated on 3rd March 1980. On this occasion three posters were released for public education -- for the better understanding of the needs and problems of the Deaf.

Shri R. Gundu Rao, Hon. Chief Minister of Karnataka was the chief guest. Prof. K.S. Hegde, Vice-Chancellor of the Mysore University presided over the function. Among the other VIP participants were Smt. Renuka Rajendran, Hon. Minister of State for Sericulture and Youth Services, Govt. of Karnataka, Shri F.M. Khan and Shri Rajashekara Murthy, both Members of Parliament.

Shri H2R. Venkataramaiah, President, Parents Association of the cases of the Institute presented a Memorandum to the Chief Minister requesting the State Government to construct a hostel in the Institute's campus for the cases who come from outside city and to open Speech and Hearing Centres in every district hospital of the State.

Guest Lectures and visit of Specialists

STUDENTS ASSOCIATION
