

# Greetings from the Director



t is my previlage to present the 49<sup>th</sup> Annual Report of the All India Institute of Speech & Hearing, Mysore. This report contains the activities of the institute for the year 2013-14.

The year 2013-14 was special in that the Institute has taken steps forward in preparing to become **Deemed to be University**. The Institute was assessed and accredited by **NAAC with the Highest A Grade** and it obtained **ISO 9001:2008** certification. It continued in academic, research, clinical and public educational activities in the area of communication and its disorders.

The Institute was given the status of **Centre of Excellence** by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India and a total amount of Rs. 137 Crores was sanctioned towards this. It was recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India to conduct **PG Diploma in Augmentative and Alternative Communication.** 

The Institute started the **up-gradatation of a Diploma programme to a Bachelors programme** at RIMS, Imphal, JIPMER, Puducherry and NSCBMC, Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh. It also submitted a **proposal on Roadmap of services of**  speech & hearing graduates in India to the Ministry.

The Institute initiated **Technology Development Board including Intellectual Property Rights** (IPR), Product Development Cell, Green Campus Initiative Cell, and Staff Grievance Cell.

**Faculty Enrichment Programmes** were initiated in the month of July, 2013 with the objective of broadening the research experience of the faculty members and to provide a platform for exchanging ideas and scholarship among the researchers across the Institute.

To promote mutual awareness and discussion of the plans, programmes, procedures, activities, challenges and achievements of the Departments of the Institute a **Departmental Peer Evaluation** was started in November, 2013.

In one of the first of its kind initiative in government sector, the Gymkhana of the Institute established the **Best AllSHian award** for the employees to recognize their outstanding and distinguished performance towards the growth and success of the Institute in August, 2013. The award is being given under four staff categories: Administrative, Scientific/ Technical, Teaching and Multitasking. The selection of eligible employees for the award was made through a multi-rater/ 360-degree feedback obtained from superiors, subordinates, peers within the department and peers across the departments within the institute.

In order to make way for perfect management of student and staff attendance, **Biometric Attendance Monitoring System** was implemented in August, 2013. The system uses fingerprints to verify identity, record time-in and time-out and generate the attendance report.

**Centre for Neuropsychological Research and Rehabilitation, Electro physiological Laboratory, Human Genetics Unit, and Epidemiology Unit** were inaugurated on 9<sup>th</sup> of August, 2013 to boost research.

A **New Born Screening Programme** for communication disorders in four states was initiated to detect communication disorders in the beginning stages of the child's development. The programme was formally inaugurated by Hon'ble Justice Dr. N Santhosh Hegde, former Lokayukta, Karnataka on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2013.

The institute launched a **Digital EPBAX system** which features state-of-the-art voice communication system. The system facilitates linking of all the remote centers of the Institute with the AIISH Intercom network.

The Institute jointly organized a two-day **Annual International Symposium on Frontiers of Research on Speech and Music** with ITC Sangeet Research Academy, Kolkata and Sir C V Raman Centre for Physics and Music, Jadavpur University, Kolkata on 13-14 March, 2014.

A Language Lab to develop the communication skills of the students, a Remote Access Information Service to provide off-campus access to the subscribed electronic information resources of the institute and an Online Newspaper Information Service to facilitate organized access to the news items on the Institute activities/events and information on communication disorders published in print media were launched by Mr. Abdul Kareem, Director, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minster of India on 27<sup>th</sup> March, 2014. Three of the buildings - **Staff Quarters**, **Audiology block, and Knowledge Park** were near completion.

During the reporting year, the staff of the institute completed 43 research projects and 34 research projects were ongoing. In addition, 14 research projects were initiated. Six candidates were awarded Ph.D., one submitted the thesis, and 39 were pursuing doctoral studies. In addition, 61 students submitted their master's dissertation and 66 candidates were pursuing their master's dissertation. Seventy three scientific papers were presented in international and national conferences / seminars and ninety seven scientific articles were published in peer reviewed international and national journals and three in conference proceedings. Also, 17 chapters in books / books were written by the staff of the institute. Three staff and students received grants to present papers in international conferences.

The institute registered 56,386 clients with communication disorders. Also 13062 new borns and 15119 infants were screened for communication disorders in 15 hospitals in Mysore, outreach service centres, and in 4 states Karnataka, Rajasthan, Manipur and Orissa. Industrial screening was done for the 367 employees of AMW-MGM Forgings Pvt. Ltd., Mysore, KSIC, Mysore and M/s. TATA Global Beverages Ltd, Banglore, and 520 school children of Mysore were screened. Two thousand thirty three clients in nine camps were screened in various parts of the country. In addition, 80 elderly persons were screened. Totally, 4447 clients were catered to in the outreach service centres of the institute at 3 PHCs located in districts of Mysore. Tele-assessment and

intervention was done for 130 and 212 clients with communication disorders. Totally, 4888 hearing aids with solar battery charges were distributed.

Twelve monthly public lectures were held and 17 public educational materials were prepared and 24 were translated in various Indian languages. The institute procured several scientific instruments, e-journals and bibliographical databases. Also, the institute received कार्यालय दोपस्मृति पुरस्कार instituted by the Rajabhasha Sansthan, New Delhi for better implementation of official language in official settings. Dr H.P. Uma Saraswathi, Hindi Translator won first prize for her paper Globalisation and Localization of Official Language Hindi in the conference, organized by the Rajabhasha Sansthan, New Delhi at Jim Corbette Park, Nainital, Uttarkand on 8-10 October, 2013. For the first time, the Institute participated in the world famous Mysore Dasara procession, the Jamboo Savari which attracts a huge audience from all over the country and abroad, on 14<sup>th</sup> October, 2013 with a tableau on communication disorders. The tableau won first prize. The Institute also had 3 public education programmes in Kasturi TV channel on MAUNA MAATAADAAGA.

Overall, the year 2013-14 was satisfying. I extend my heartfelt thanks to all my colleagues who have supported for the cause of progress of the Institute.

# **Major Events and New Initiatives**

The Institute witnessed many educational, research and clinical care activities and events and infrastructure developments during the reporting year. Also, a number of new and innovative practices were implemented towards further progress in the functioning Institute. A few of them are given below.

### **Pre-school Graduation Day**

The Pre-school Graduation Ceremony was held on 26th April, 2013 during which forty eight children who graduated from the pre-school in 2012-13 were felicitated. Mr. Balaram H S, District Disability Welfare Officer, Mysore, Mr. Raghunandhan R, Block Education Officer, South Zone, Mysore and Ms. Pushpa.K.S, Block Resource Coordinator, Mysore were the guests of honour and Dr. S. R. Savithri, Director, AIISH presided over the function.



### **Staff Grievance Cell**

In the spirit of seeking to establish a responsive administration, a Staff Grievance Cell was constituted in June, 2013. The Cell will act as a forum for employees to ventilate their grievances relating to official matters. Also it will suggest necessary measures to be taken by the Administration to resolve the grievances thereby facilitating a healthy working atmosphere in the Institute.

### Technology Development Board including Intellectual Property Rights (IPR):

With the objective of creating a Nodal Centre for protecting the technologies developed at the Institute pertaining to communication disorders and allied areas and to effectively commercialize them, a Technology Development Board including Intellectual Property Rights was established in June, 2013. The Board will safeguard the IPRs by appropriately patenting the technologies and entering into contracts.

### Product Development Cell

A Product Development Cell was established for the development of products from among the technologies developed in different Departments of the Institute in the miniature scale by appropriately upgrading, revising, and modifying so as to make the technologies so developed, commercially viable for harnessing and exploiting as well as appropriate documenting. The Cell was initiated in June, 2013 and it is constituted of a Chairperson, one technical staff /faculty from each Department as members and the Publicity and Information Officer as Member Secretary.

### Center of Excellence

The Hon'ble Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India, New Delhi accorded administrative approval for the Up-gradation of the Institute as Centre of Excellence in the field of Communication Disorders at a total cost of Rs.137 crore on 18<sup>th</sup> July, 2013. The proposal on upgradation was presented by Dr. S.R. Savithri, Director, AIISH in the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare under the Chairmanship of Sri Keshav Desiraju, Secretary (Health), Govt. of India, New Delhi on 14<sup>th</sup> June, 2013.

### Green Campus Initiative Cell

In order to make the Institute campus more sustainable and environmentally friendly which is free from pollution of all kinds, a Green Campus Initiative Cell was constituted in the month of June, 2013. The Cell will take steps in identifying and implementing practical and measurable green campus solutions through the volunteer efforts of staff and students.

### Faculty Enrichment Programme

Faculty enrichment programme has initiated in the month of July, 2013 with the objective of broadening the research experience of the faculty members and to provide a platform for exchanging ideas and scholarship among the researchers across the Institute.

### Best AllSHian Award

### Departmental Peer Evaluation

### Biometric Attendance System

In order to make way for perfect management of student and staff attendance, an automatic attendance monitoring system was implemented in August, 2013. The system uses fingerprints to verify identity, record time-in and time-out and generate the attendance report. The system is administered and monitored by the Department of Electronics.

# Centre for Neuropsychological Research and Rehabilitation

A Centre for Neuropsychological Research and Rehabilitation was set up in the Department of Clinical Psychology to cater to persons with brain damage or dysfunction having communication disorders. The facility was inaugurated by Hon'ble Justice Dr. N Santhosh Hegde, former Lokayukta, Karnataka on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2013.



### Electrophysiological Laboratory

In order to promote basic and applied research in the area of auditory electrophysiology and facilitate database development in the area an Electrophysiological Laboratory was set up at the Department of Audiology which was opened by Hon'ble Justice Dr. N. Santhosh Hegde, Former Lokayukta, Karnataka on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2013.



### **Human Genetics Unit**

With the aim of investigating the genetic cause of highly prevalent communication disorders, a Human Genetics Unit was set up in the Department of Speech-Language Sciences. The unit will construct pedigrees to determine the pattern of genetic inheritance in persons with communication disorders and also conduct research on phenotype and genotype by maintaining database on communication disorders in the Indian population. In addition, the facility will develop a database of DNA sequence analysis of persons with communication disorders and spread awareness among professionals and general public on genetically transmitted syndromes and disorders related to communication. The unit was formally launched by Hon'ble Justice Dr. N Santhosh Hegde, former Lokayukta, Karnataka on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2013.



### **Epidemiology Unit**

An Epidemiology Unit was established in the Department of Prevention of Communication Disorders to get a centralized data bank for all activities of prevention and early identification of communication disorders and to promote epidemiologic research in the area. The unit was formally opened by Dr. M.G. Krishnan, Vice-Chancellor, Karnataka State Open University on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2013.

Mathew, Executive Director, National Institute of Speech and Hearing, Trivandrum, (Member

Coordinator) visited the Institute on 24-26 September, 2013 and apprised itself of the performance of the Institute on the following seven parameters: Curricular aspects; Teaching- Learning Evaluation; Research, Consultancy and and Extension; Infrastructure and Learning resources; Student Support and Progression; Governance, Leadership and Management; Innovations and best practices. The peer team also had interaction with the students, parents, alumni, teaching and nonteaching staff, top management and were very impressed with the feedback received from the various stakeholders during the interactions and appreciative of the activities of the institute in the of academics, research, clinical field and infrastructure and extra-curricular activities.

Around 500 people including revered personalities from various spheres who have been persistently working towards the betterment of the quality of life for persons with disabilities and the general public attended the event. The clients/ parents/ caregivers/ stakeholders and other activists who

significantly contributed either at an individual level or at an organizational level to bring an altruistic change in the lives of persons with disabilities were felicitated during the event.



### ISO 9001:2008 Certification

The institute took forward the quality initiative by voluntarily implementing the international standard of ISO 9001:2008 in respect of its four verticals of Human Resources Development through teaching-learning, Clinical Services, Research and Public Education in the field of Communication Disorders. M/s Indian Register Quality Systems (IRQS), Mumbai, a National Accreditation Board for Certification Bodies conducted Stage I Audit of Document Review in February, 2014 and the Stage II Audit of Certification Audit in March, 2014. The ISO Auditors did not find any non-conformances which is in itself a rare feat and recommended the institute for ISO Certification straightaway and awarded the ISO 9001:2008 certificate on 28<sup>th</sup> March, 2014.

### International Symposium on Frontiers of Research on Speech and Music

The Institute jointly organized a two-day Annual International Symposium on Frontiers of Research on Speech and Music (FRSM - 2014) with ITC Sangeet Research Academy, Kolkata and Sir C V Raman Centre for Physics and Music, Jadavpur University, Kolkata on 13-14 March, 2014. The objective of the symposium was to promote research in speech and music by researchers in the fields of physics, mathematics, musicology, speech science, linguistics, electronics and computer science. Dr. T.V. Ananthapadmanabha, Chief Executive Officer, Voice and Speech Systems, Bangalore, and Awadesh Kumar Misra, Director, Central Institute of Indian Languages, Mysore were the chief guests of the symposium in which Mr. Keikichi Hirose, University of Tokyo, Japan, delivered the keynote address. Around 120 national and international delegates attended the symposium.



### Language Laboratory

With the objective of developing English language Communication skills of the students, a Language Lab was opened in the Institute by Mr. Abdul Kareem, Director, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minster of India on 27<sup>th</sup> March, 2014. The facility is based on Orell Digital Language Lab software and is with 10 student modules and one teacher module.



### Remote Access Information Service

In order to facilitate off campus access to the subscribed electronic information resources by the staff and students, a Remote Access Information Service was launched by Mr. Abdul Kareem, Director, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minster of India on 27<sup>th</sup> March, 2014. The facility is based EZProxy, a software published by Online Computer Library Centre, USA.



### **Online Newspaper Information Service**

This service facilitates organized online access to the news items on the Institute activities/events and information on communication disorders published in print media. The service which is based on News NIC, a software developed by the National Informatics Centre, New Delhi was launched by Mr. Abdul Kareem, Director, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minster of India on 27<sup>th</sup> March, 2014.

# Learning and Teaching

The AIISH is a premier educational establishment pertaining to communication and its disorders in the country which caters both the national and overseas human resource needs in the field. Various educational activities carried out at the institute during the reporting year are given below.

### Academic Programmes Offered

The institute offered 14 academic programmes ranging from certificate to post- doctorates during the reporting year. Of these, Diploma in Hearing, Language and Speech (DHLS) was offered at 12 centers across the country and classes were delivered from the institute through video conferencing. Graduate, post-graduate diploma, post-graduate degree and doctoral programmes had the approval of the University of Mysore/ Rehabilitation Council of India. Table 1 shows the details of the programmes offered in 2013-14.

### **Admission and Enrolment**

National level entrance examinations were conducted to admit students to B.Sc. (Sp. & Hg.), M.Sc. (Audiology) and M.Sc. (Speech - Language Pathology). Totally, 577 candidates appeared for the B.Sc. (Sp. & Hg.) entrance examination held in different parts of the country. Entrance examinations to M.Sc. (Audiology) and M.Sc. (Speech-Language Pathology) held at the institute campus in Mysore were attended by 164 and 165 candidates, respectively. Admissions to all the diploma, post-graduate diploma, bachelor of special education and masters in special education programmes were done based on the merit obtained in the respective qualifying examinations.




Figure 1: Student intake 2013-14




Figure 2: State-wise admission

The total number of students admitted to various programmes during the reporting year was 329, and 203 among them were girls. The number of students admitted to each programme is given in figure 1 and the state-wise admission is given in figure 2.

### **Academic Performance**




Figure 3: Academic performance

The students performed well in the university examinations conducted last year with 100 percentage pass in M.Sc. (Audiology) examination, 97 percentage in M.Sc. (SLP) and 88 percentage in B.Sc.(Sp. & Hg.). The details of academic degrees awarded during the reporting year are given in table 3 and figure 3.

### Internship

Sixty one students underwent internship training during the reporting year. # **Clinical Care**

The Institute offers a comprehensive range of clinical services pertaining to communication disorders. These include general speech, language and hearing assessment and rehabilitation and a wide range of specialized testing and treatment services. Also, it offers psychological and otorhinolagyngolical assessment and rehabilitation and various medical specialty services to the persons with communication disorders.

## Patient Registration

Totally 56,386 persons were registered for availing clinical services at the institute during the reporting year. This includes 20,896 new and 35,490 review cases. The geographical details of new clients are given in table 13. Majority of them (19647) were from Karnataka, the state in which the institute is located, followed by the neighboring states of Kerala (700), Tamil Nadu (173) and Andra Pradesh (182). There were 13 clients from north-east region. In addition, there were 11 clients from the other countries across the world. Males (13029) outnumbered females (7867) in availing clinical services and the major age group of clients was 20-40 followed by 40-60 with 5536 and 3884 numbers, respectively.

The total number of persons with various communication disorders who availed speech language therapy, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, listening training and other special clinic therapies is 12633.

Speech and Language Assessment and Rehabilitation

The speech and language outpatient unit evaluated 8007 clients during the reporting year. Of them, 7584 were identified with various kinds of speech and language disorders and 423 were found to have normal speech. The details of clients with speech and language disorders along with the category of disorders are given in table 14 and figure 4.

Clients requiring further management were given various speech/language therapies depending upon the type and severity of disorder, for a number of daily sessions of 45 minutes duration. A total of 74997 therapy sessions were conducted for 6250 persons with speech/ language disorders who attended therapy during the reporting year. The details of disorder- wise therapy carried out are given in table 15.

Speech and language assessment and therapeutic services were also provided at the 12 DHLS centres of the Institute located throughout the country, the details of which are given in table 16.







#### Audiological Assessment and Rehabilitation

Hearing evaluation of 13734 clients was carried out by administering various audiological tests such as pure tone audiometry, speech audiometry and otoacoustic emission and threshold-equalizing noise test. Totally, 27368 ears were diagnosed with different degrees of hearing loss including severe (4596) and profound (4572) cases. Further, different types of hearing loss such as sensorineural loss, mixed, conductive, auditory processing disorders and auditory dys-synchrony were identified during the evaluation. The details of hearing evaluation and diagnosis are given in table 17 and figures 5-8.

Hearing aid trial was done for 10612 clients to determine the appropriate hearing aids and assistive learning devices. The candidacy for cochlear implants was also determined. The detailed statistics on hearing aid trial and hearing aids prescribed during the report year are given in table 18.







Figure 8: Other hearing disorders diagnosed





Figure 9: Graphical representation of age-wise audiological assessment




Figure 10: Audiological services at the DHLS centers

# Referred Evaluation-1: Psychological Assessment and Rehabilitation

Psychological assessment was carried out for the deserving cases with communication disorders registered at the institute by the Department of Clinical Psychology. This includes pre-vocational assessment for adolescent/adults with communication disorders, neuro-psychological evaluations for individuals with neuro-linguistic /communication problems, psycho-educational achievement testing and grade level assessment for children with scholastic backwardness and academic under achievement and behavior assessment for children with problem deficits. addition, behaviors/skill In family assessment was done on specific cases requiring family intervention programmes.




Figure 11: Psychological assessment

Psychological assessment of 5156 new and 1104 review cases was done at the clinic during the reporting year. This includes 148 Hindi cases. The new cases include patients with mental retardation (2051), expressive language disorders (1102), hearing loss (714), learning disability (739), stuttering (349), misarticulation (193), aphasia (60), autism (21), cerebral palsy (68), functional voice disorders (1), voice problem (11) and others (951). The details are given in figure 11.

## Referred Evaluation-2: Otorhinolaryngological Assessment and Rehabilitation

The Otorhino-laryngological assessment and rehabilitation for persons with communication disorders are being carried out at the Department of Otorhinolaryngology. In addition to the clinical services provided at the Institute, the Department staff render diagnostic, therapeutic and surgical services at K.R. Hospital, Mysore Medical College.

Totally 22,658 new and 16,730 review cases were examined during the reporting year at the institute and 22,239 microscopic, 34 endoscopic, 176 vertigo, 192 stroboscopic, 56 oto endoscopic and 19 diagnostic naso endoscopic examinations were carried out. Also, 5973 new and 6371 review cases were examined and 205 major and 156 minor surgeries were successfully carried out at K.R. Hospital. 


Figure 12: Otorhinolaryngological diagnostics

## **Specialized Clinical Services**

The institute provided a variety of specialized clinical services and evaluations for individuals with communication disorders during the reporting year at the following clinical units.




Figure 13:AAC evaluation

Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) Unit: The AAC unit supported, enhanced and provided alternative methods of communication for individuals who are non-verbal. The unit evaluated 34 new cases in 63 sessions and 271 therapy cases in 1538 sessions during the reporting year. It also attended six demonstration therapy and three home training cases. In addition, five UG and 47 PG students of the Institute were given training in 114 sessions. The details of AAC evaluation are given in figure 13.

Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) Unit: Assessment and treatment were provided for 329 clients with autism spectrum disorders at the ASD unit during the reporting year. Of them, 40 were from Hindi region. The unit also attended 917 therapy and 73 demonstration therapy cases. Forty one therapy cases discharged and 81 discontinued during the period. The total number of therapy sessions conducted was 5311.

The occupational therapy section of the unit evaluated 166 cases in 180 sessions. There were 677 therapy cases and 40 Demonstration Therapy cases. Totally, 3828 therapy sessions were carried out. Fifteen cases were discharged, 25 discontinued and 87 re-evaluated. **Clinic for Adult and Elderly Persons with Language Disorders (CAEPLD):** CAEPLD provides clinical services to adult and elderly persons. Totally, 11 clients were evaluated in the clinic during the reporting year.

**Fluency Unit:** This unit catered to the needs of persons with stuttering and other fluency disorders and provided clinical services to 594 (549 new cases and 45 review cases)persons with fluency disorders during the reporting year. The unit also enabled the professionals to conduct research on neuroanatomical, neurophysiological and genetic aspects of fluency disorders.

Implantable Hearing Devices Unit: The activities of this unit include selection of candidates, mapping/ programming, trouble shooting of implantable hearing devices such as cochlear implant, boneanchored hearing aids and middle ear implants. Rehabilitation of individuals using such devices was also undertaken. Apart from this, student training and research activities were also conducted. Totally 91 mapping and 46 unaided/aided audiograms for Cochlear Implants were done at the unit during the reporting year. In addition, 45 bone anchored hearing aids were tried and 49 Cochlear Implant devices trouble shooted.




Figure 14: Activities of LDC

Learning Disability Clinic: The objectives of the clinic include early identification of students with learning disability, undertake their detailed evaluation by a multi-disciplinary team of experts, plan individualized remediation programmes for the identified students, serve as nodal center for issue of certificates for certain educational concessions, conduct action research to facilitate advocacy, policy change and public education and develop related literature/ materials for or about students with learning disabilities. The details of the activities carried out at the clinic during the reporting year are given in figure 14.




Figure 15: Activities of LT Unit

**Listening Training (LT) Unit:** Clients who use hearing devices were provided with listening training. Training was also imparted to clients having tinnitus, hyperacusis as well as cochlear implantees. Totally, 3322 persons underwent listening training comprising of 19362 sessions during the reporting year. The detailed statistics on listening training activities are given in table 24 and figure 15.




Figure 16: Activities of MSD unit

**Motor Speech Disorders Unit:** This specialized unit caters to the needs of persons with Motor Speech Disorders. It enables them to realize their potential and become contributing members of the society. The detailed clinical statistics of the unit for the reporting year are given in Figure 16.

**Neuropsychology Unit:** This is a new unit opened during the reporting year. It will serve as a nodal point in the area of neuro-cognitive research and rehabilitation for clinical conditions like Aphasia, Cerbrovascular Accidents (Stroke or CVA), Learning Disability (LD), Cerebral Palsy, Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), Parkinson's Disease, Dementias, and other progressive or non-progressive neurological disorders.

The service offered in the centre includes the assessment of specific function of the brain through standard individualized test, detailed

assessment of lobular functions through standardized batteries and rehabilitation through paper pencil techniques or through computer assisted packages. Totally 152 Neuropsychological assessments and 84 Neuropsychological rehabilitation were made during the reporting year in the unit.

**Professional Voice Care (PVC) Unit**: The unit provided specialized assessment and management services to professional voice users during the reporting year. It organized various programs to orient and sensitize professional voice users on care, maintenance and conservation of voice. Specialized training in the assessment and counseling of professional voice users was imparted to 16 final year M.Sc. (SLP) and 30 Internship students for 181 hours and 231 hours, respectively.





Figure 17: U-SOFA Evaluation

**Structural Orofacial Anomalies (U- SOFA) Unit:** Clients with deformalities in the growth of head and facial bones were given multi-disciplinary diagnostic and rehabilitatiion services in the clinic. Totally 234 clients were evaluated at the clinic by the experts. The detailed clinical statistics of the unit are given in figures 17-18 and table 25.

**Vertigo Clinic:** The clinic offered comprehensive care in evaluation and management of patients with vertigo. A multidisciplinary team comprising of ENT surgeon, neurologist and audiologist evaluated 227 patients in the clinic for both peripheral and central vertigo during the reporting year and diagnostic tests like microscopic examination of ear, electronystagmography, vestibulo spinal tests, neurological evaluation, video nystagmography, audiological tests and vestibular evoked myogenic potential test were carried out for the needy ones.

**Voice Clinic**: This clinic offered evaluation and management services to persons of all ages with voice disorders. So far, 229 clients with voice disorders were evaluated in the clinic using video stroboscopy and software for voice assessment.




Figure 19: Medical specialty & allied health

Medical Specialty & Allied Health Services The institute facilitated the services of various medical specialists such as pediatrician, neurologist, plastic surgeon, prosthodontist, orthodontist, phono- surgeon and services of allied health professionals such as physiotherapist and occupational therapist, to the needy clients. Totally 845 patients underwent occupational therapy in 5931 sessions and 819 underwent physiotherapy in 7234 sessions, during the reporting year. In addition, 651, 342, 177, 33, 5 and 192 clients consulted neurologist, pediatrician, plastic surgeon, ortho-dontist, prosthodontist and phono-surgeon, respectively. The details are given in figure 19.

## **Special Educational Services**

The institute provided special educational services to children with communication disorders belonging to different age groups under the aegis of the Department of Special Education. The major services given during the reporting year are the following.

**Parent Infant Programme**: This caters to very young children with communication disorders in their infancy and toddlerhood. During the reporting year, 25 such children (8 Kannada, 15 Malayalam, 1 Hindi and 1 Telugu) were provided early stimulation services through 1452 sessions.

**Pre-school Parent Empowerment Programme:** Parents of 81 children of two years and above age suffering from various communication disorders were empowered to prepare their children for preschool. Language wise, 45 Kannada, 27 Malayalam, 5 Hindi, 3 Telugu, and 1 Tamil parents benefitted the service in 1216 sessions.

**Pre-school Training:** Totally 221 children with communication disorders underwent preschool training in 181604 sessions during the reporting year. This includes children with autism (42), mental retardation (81) and hearing loss (92). Among them 06 children had multiple disabilities.

**Curricular Support Services:** Seventy children with communication disorders studying in normal schools were provided with curricular support services, individualized education plan and demonstration therapy in 2863 sessions during the reporting year.

**Counseling and Guidance:** This service was provided to caregivers and educators in the field for helping them support the education of children with communication disorders. Totally, 369 persons received counseling and guidance in 2696 sessions.

**Co-curricular Service:** As part of pre-school services, 189 young children with communication disorders were trained in co-curricular activities like physical exercises, yoga, music, dance and games in 282 sessions.

**Computer Training:** Twenty three care givers/parents of special children were given basic computer training in 658 sessions.

**Literacy Training:** The Caregivers' Literacy Training Unit of the Department provided training in reading, wring and arithmetic skills for 9 parents of special children in 118 sessions.

**Sensori-neural training:** Apart from the regular routine aspects of co-curricular training like Yoga, physical exercises and play activities, performing

arts, and visual arts; children with multiple sensory issues are provided daily training in sensory motor integration and self-help skills using specialised materials like balancing beam, acupressure mats and balls, therapeutic balls, trampoline, multiswing, etc. In the reported year 109 children had received training through 122 sessions.

**Organization of Summer Camp:** A one month summer camp was organized for children with disability from 1<sup>st</sup> May 31 May, 2013 and 60 children attended the camp.

## **Clinical Support Services**

The institute extended a diverse range of support services to patients and their family. These include the following.

**Distribution and Repairing of Hearing Aids:** The Department of Electronics of the Institute carried out the electro-acoustic evaluation, management and issue of hearing aids. Hearing aids were distributed under ADIP Scheme of Ministry of Social

Justice and Empowerment, Government of India and AIISH Hearing Aid Dispensing Scheme. Totally 3358 hearing aids with solar battery chargers were distributed at the main campus (3036), camps (322), and clinical outreach centers (602), after electro-acoustic evaluation and testing under ADIP scheme. Under AIISH Hearing Aid Dispensing Scheme, 1530 hearing aids were issued at concessional rate. The department also repaired 407 body level and 582 BTE hearing aids.


**Counseling and Guidance:** The professional experts of the Institute provided counseling and guidance on various aspects of the disorders such as treatment procedures, usage and care of tools like hearing aids during the reporting year.

**Distribution of toy kits:** Fifty toy kits were distributed to eligible disabled children below poverty line during the International Day of Persons with Disabilities on 3rd December 2013.

# **Outreach Services**

In addition to the diagnostic and therapeutic services provided within its walls, the institute provides various outreach activities pertaining to communication and its disorders in different parts of the country. The following outreach services were carried out during the reporting year.

#### **Communication Disorder Screening Programmes**

The Department of Prevention of Communication Disorders of the Institute conducted screening programmes for communication disorders in different settings in various localities. The individuals participating in the programmes were checked for speech, language and hearing abilities and provided with diagnostic and therapeutic services. The screening programmes conducted during the reporting year in different settings are mentioned below.




Figure 21 : Screening done in different settings

#### **Infant Screening**

Under this programme, neonates and infants were screened using various tools such as High Risk Register for communication disorders, Behavioral Observation Audiometry, Oto Acoustic Emission Screening and Screening Checklists to identify the risk factors that could lead to communication disorders.

Screening programme was carried out at the hospitals/immunization centres in and around Mysore, outreach clinical centres and hospitals attached to the DHLS centres of the institute, and

the parents / caregivers were counseled regarding the identification of any delay or deviancies in normal developmental milestones of speech, language, hearing, motor and other related domains that affect the development of communication skills in children.

Screening at the hospitals in Mysore: Screening was carried out at 15 hospitals and 3 immunization centres in and around Mysore throughout the year and totally 13363 babies were screened and 243 (1.81%) among them were referred to the institute for follow-up. The details are given in table 29.




Figure 22: Infant screening at outreach service centres &other hospitals

Screening at Outreach Service Centres and Other Hospitals: The infant screening was also carried out at the outreach centres of the institute located in Akkihebbalu and Hullahalli, and the three government hospitals at K.R.Nagar, Santhemaralli and T.Narsipura. A total of 1756 infants were screened, of which 22 (1.25%) were referred for detailed assessment, the details of which are given in table 30 and figure 22.

Newborn Screening at Hospitals of DHLS Centres:




Figure 23: Newborn screening at DHLS hospitals

The new born screening was also carried out at the hospitals attached to the three DHLS centers, namely Sri Ramachandra Bhanj Medical College and Hospital, Cuttack (2905), Regional Institute of Medical Sciences Imphal (3848), Janana Hospital & JLNMCH, Ajmer (6309). Totally 13062 babies were screened and 643 (4.92%) of them were referred for follow-up. A complete test battery was administered for those who came for follow up. The details are given in figure 23.

## Industrial Screening

Hearing evaluation of industrial workers, were carried out for the employees working in the AMW-MGM Forgings Pvt. Ltd., Mysore, KSIC, Mysore and M/s. TATA Global Beverages Limited, Bangalore. Of the 215 persons screened, 71 (33.02%) were referred to the institute for further check-up.

In addition, 152 employees of Karnataka Silk Industries Co., Mysore, were evaluated for hearing

at the institute and 144 (94.73%) of them were identified with hearing impairment ranging from minimal to severe hearing loss. The employees were counseled on the need to use hearing protective devices.

#### **School Screening**

Nursery and primary school students of the St. Joseph's School, Mysore, were screened for communication disorder as a part of the school screening programme during the reporting year. Totally 520 students were screened and 27 (5.19%) of them were recommended for follow-up at the Institute.

#### **Elderly Screening**

Speech, language and hearing evaluation were carried out for elderly citizens residing in different old age homes in Mysore. Eighty persons underwent the evaluation and 25 (31.25%) among them who had hearing problem were provided with hearing aids. The details are given in table 31.

## Diagnostic and Therapeutic Services at Outreach Service Centres




Figure 24 : Clinical services at outreach service centres

Communication disorders related diagnostic and therapeutic services were provided at the three outreach centres of the institute located in Gumballi, Chamarajanagar, Akkihebbalu, Mandya, and Hullahalli, Nanjangud. Totally 4447 persons availed the services. The details of the evaluation are given in figure 24. In addition to the evaluation provided, 441 hearing aids were issued to the needy ones.




Figure 25: Tele-intervention

In addition, tele-intervention was also provided to 11 clients in 128 sessions through SKYPE, the webbased audio-video communication system.

## Website-based Service

The Centre for Rehabilitation and Education through Distance Mode addressed queries related to communication disorders, their assessment and management by providing various resource materials over its website. Totally, 4458 persons visited the site for availing the service during the reporting year. In addition, the website provided a helpline service for persons with Parkinson's disease.

## **Tele-Educational Guidance and Counseling**

Educational guidance and counseling were given to 14 parents of children with communication

disorders at the DHLS study centres through videoconferencing and the SKYPE to make them understand how the child's special need might affect his education, how to prepare him for schooling, help in deciding appropriate schools for the child and inform them of various benefits and concessions offered by the central and state governments for the children with special needs.

## **Mainstream School Adoption**

In order to ensure proper care for the children with communication disorders, studying in normal schools, a mainstream school adoption programme was initiated and 11 schools were adopted and 130 teachers in these schools were oriented through 19 programmes on identification of special needs in children, curricular adaptation and management of

their special educational needs in the inclusive learning environments.



### **Public Education**

The institute has been taking various steps to make the common man aware of communication disorders, educate them on prevention of the disorders and provide guidance and counseling to persons suffering from such disorders. 


Figure 26: Public orientation programmes

### **Other Activities and Events**

Other activities that are being carried out at the Institute include library and information services, technological consultancy services, material development activities, infrastructure development, personnel and financial management. ### Infrastructure Development and Maintenance

The infrastructure development and maintenance activities of the institute are being carried out mainly by the Department of Electronics and the Engineering and Horticulture sections.

### **Electronic and I.T. Infrastructure**

The electronic, electrical and I.T. infrastructure development and maintenance activities of the institute are being carried out by the Department of Electronics. The institute spent Rs. 83.3007 lakhs towards this during the reporting year and the major developmental activities completed include (a) design and development of asset management system, and (b) installation of Digital EPABX system.

### **Civil Engineering Infrastructure**

The engineering section completed 03 major construction works worth Rs. 2601.87 lakhs during the reporting year, which include the construction of knowledge park with a seminar hall and class rooms, forty eight nos. of type II and type III staff quarters and audiometric block. Also, the section completed 37 minor works worth Rs. 69.66 lakhs during the reporting year.

### **Garden and Landscape Development**

The Horticulture Section has been carrying out the development and maintenance of gardens, lawns and other landscaping works in the institute campus. The gardens spread across the campus are enriched with herbs, shrubs, climbers, creepers and trees of perennial nature.



The major activities carried out by the section during the period include: (a) development of 4700 sq. ft. of shaded lawn in the main campus, (b) development of 4585 sq. mtrs. of lawn for cricket ground at Panchavati Campus, (c) 800 nos. of various varieties of indoor and outdoor ornamental plants, and (d) development of 4000 annual flowering plants in pots.

The Section represented the institute in the Dasara Horticultural Flower Show, 2013, organized by the Department of Horticulture, Government of Karnataka, at Curzon park, Mysore and won 17 First prizes, 4 Second prizes for arranging various types of flower groups and won 5 First prizes for well garden maintenance and growing various flowers in pots and beds at the institute premises.

### Library and Information Services

The following library and Information services and activities were carried out during the reporting year.

### **Acquisition of Information Resources**

Totally 743 print books were purchased during the reporting year making the total collection to 19776. In addition, 113 Journals, both in print and electronic format, were subscribed and 83 research reports were added to the In-house Digital Repository. Also, the Institute received more than 2700 e-journals as a part of ERMED consortium of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and more than 90,000 e-books and 3000 e-journals as a part of NLIST service of the Information and Library Network, University Grants Commission, Govt. of India.

### **Information Services**

The various information services provided during the reporting year include book lending, reference, current awareness, Internet, online public access catalogue, web portal based CD-ROM access, online database and VPN based resource access to the DHLS centres and plagiarism detection services.

### Personnel Management


