Greetings from the Director



I am happy to present the 50th Annual Report of the All India Institute of Speech & Hearing, Mysore, when the institute has entered in to the 50th year. This report contains the activities of the institute for the year 2014-15.

The institute successfully underwent an external surveillance audit of ISO 9001:2008 and took forward the quality initiative by voluntarily implementing the international standard in respect of its four verticals of Human Resources Development through Teaching-learning, Clinical Services, Research and Public Education in the field of Communication Disorders.

The infrastructure facilities have been improved by constructing and opening type II and type III staff quarters for Group B and Group C consisting of 48 apartments built on a plinth area of 45,454.65 Sq.ft,, a new academic block by name Knowledge Park which houses 10 classrooms and a 450 seater seminar Hall at a total plinth area of 3,183.45 Sq.m., and a new Audiology Block with 21 acoustic rooms for hearing evaluation. The Knowledge Park and Audiology Block were inaugurated by Dr. Harshvardhan, Hon. Minister for Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India on 17.10.2014. The minister also

laid down the Foundation stone for the Center of Excellence, and Speech and Hearing Museum.

During the reporting year, the Institute continued its academic, research, clinical and public educational activities in the area of communication and its disorders. With the approval of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India, the DHLS programme at JIPMER, Puducherry, Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal, and Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Medical College, Jabalpur was upgraded to BASLP programme and MoU was entered into with these Institutions on 9.8.2014 in the presence of Dr. A. K. Panda, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India.

New Born Screening Programme was extended to 3 more Medical College hospitals, NSCBMC, Jabalpur, JIPMER, Puducherry, and RIMS, Ranchi. An Outreach Service Center at Sagar Taluk Hospital, Karnataka commenced.

The Institute was recognized as a collaborative Organization for the Rashtriya Bal Swashya Karyakram (RBSK) program of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India.

Selection Committee meeting for the post of Reader in Speech Sciences, and Assessment Promotion Scheme for the posts of Professor in Audiology, Reader in ENT, Reader in Clinical Linguistics was held under the chairmanship of Dr. A. K. Panda, IAS, Additional Secretary (Health) on 29.10.2014. 55th Executive Council meeting was held on 17.10.2014 under the Chairmanship of Dr. Harshvardhan, Honarable Minister for Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India and the 46th Finance Committee meeting under the Chairmanship of Dr. A. S. Panda, IAS, Additional Secretary (Health), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, New Delhi on 29.10.2014.



The Golden Jubilee of the Institute was inaugurated by releasing the Logo by Dr. A. K. Panda, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India on 9.8.2014. The inauguration of the Swallowing Disorders Laboratory, Parent Infant Program and Assistive Device for Museum visitors with Hearing Impairment was also carried during the occasion.

The Institute organized a two-day National Symposium on Acoustics on 12-14 November, 2014. The staff of the institute completed 22 research projects and 26 research projects were ongoing. In addition, 23 research projects were initiated. Three candidates were awarded Ph.D., four candidates submitted the Ph. D. thesis, and 39 candidates were pursuing doctoral studies. In addition, 70 students submitted their master's dissertation and 70 candidates were pursuing their master's dissertation. Eighty three scientific papers were presented in international and national conferences/ seminars and 95 scientific articles were published in peer reviewed international and national journals and 36 in in-house journal. Also, 12 books/ test materials were published by the staff of the institute. One staff received grants to present papers in international conferences.

The institute registered 63,450 clients with communication disorders. 26334 new borns were screened for communication disorders in 15 hospitals in Mysore, outreach service centres, and in 4 states -Karnataka, Rajasthan, Manipur and Odissa. Industrial screening was done for the 245 employees of KSIC, Rane Madras, and Bhaba Atomic Research Centre, 5247 children in schools of Mysore, and 170 elderly were screened. 1812 clients in Nine camps were

screened in various parts of the country. 2111 clients were catered to in the outreach service centres of the institute at 3 PHCs located in districts of Mysore. Teleassessment and intervention was done for 43 and 116 clients with communication disorders. Totally 4286 hearing aids with solar battery chargers were distributed under ADIP scheme and 1831 under AHAD scheme. Twelve monthly public lectures were held and 20 public educational materials were prepared.



Shreyank Swamy, 2nd Year M. Sc. (Audiology) student. In addition, the staff and students of the Institute received best scientific paper awards in various seminars and conferences.


Overall the year 2014-15 was gratifying. I extend my heartfelt thanks to all my colleagues who have supported for the cause of progress of the Institute.

LEARNING AND TEACHING



he All India Institute of Speech and Hearing is a premier educational establishment pertaining to communication and its disorders in the country which caters both the national and overseas human resource needs in the field. Various educational activities carried out at the institute during the reporting year are given below.

Academic Programmes Offered

The institute offered 16 academic programmes ranging from certificate to post- doctorates during the reporting year. Of these, Diploma in Hearing, Language and Speech (DHLS) was offered at nine centers across the country and classes were delivered from the institute through videoconferencing. The programmes offered had the approval of the Rehabilitation Council of India/ Indira Gandhi national Open University/University of Mysore. The programmes offered are given below.

Admission and Enrolment

National level entrance examinations were conducted to admit students to B.Sc. (Sp. & Hg.), M.Sc. (Audiology), M.Sc. (Speech – Language Pathology) and M.S.Ed. (Hearing Impairment). Totally, 773 candidates appeared for the B.Sc. (Sp. & Hg.) entrance examination held in different parts of the country conducted on 14th June, 2014. Entrance Examinations to M.Sc. (Audiology), M.Sc. (Speech-Language Pathology) and M.S.Ed. (HI) held at the institute campus in Mysore on 11th July, 2014 were attended by 126, 123 and nine candidates respectively. Admission to all the diploma, post-graduate diploma and bachelor of special education



Academic Performance







The Institute signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for research collaboration with Indian Institute of Technology, Guwahati to develop technology for improving the quality of Ufe of cleft palate population on 9th August, 2014. The MoU hopes to trigger collaborative research in areas which include the academic fields of speech and hearing, linguistics and phonetics, and blo-medical signal and image processing. The first research initiative under this collaborative research program is to develop an option to provide inferences to the surgeon while correcting a cleft lip or palate. In this collaborative research, the team from AIISH, Mysore will be lead by Prof. M. Pushpavathi and Prof. Ajish K. Abraham whereas the IIT Guwahati team will be lead by Prof. S. Dandapath and Prof. S. R. M. Presenne.

As a part of extending its research and development activities pertaining to communication disorders at the international level, the Institute initiated a research collaboration with Leibniz University Hannover, Germany for establishing an Early Child Communication Leb. Dr. S.R. Sevithri, Director of the Institute attended the first meeting for strategic planning in this regard at the Department of Speech and Language Pedagogy and the International office of Leibniz University, Hannover, Germany on 3-12 October, 2014 and held a discussion with the University authorities regarding the finalization of the resources and infrastructure and funding. Later, on 21-23 January, 2015, Prof. Habil Ulrike M. Ludtke, Faculty of Humanities, Dept. of Speech-Language Pathology of the University visited AIISH for further discussion in the matter.

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

Also, it offers psychological and otorhinolagyngolical assessment and rehabilitation and various medical specialty services to the persons with communication disorders.

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
Patient Registration

Totally 63,450 persons were registered for availing clinical services at the institute during the reporting year. This includes 22,650 new and 40,800 review cases. The geographical details of new clients are given in table 8. Majority of them (21346) were from Karnataka, the state in which the institute is located, followed by the neighboring states of Kerala (803), Andra Pradesh (206) and Tamil Nadu (161). There were 6 clients from north-east region. In addition, there were 10 clients from abroad. Females (8550) outnumbered males (14100) in availing clinical services.

Totally, 11,586 persons with various communication disorders availed speech- language therapy, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, listening training and other special clinic therapies in 66,745 sessions.



Speech and Language Assessment and Rehabilitation

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


Figure 2: Speech-Language Assessment

The speech and language outpatient unit evaluated 8911 clients which includes 7203 new and 1708 review cases. Of the new cases, 6812 were identified with various kinds of speech and language disorders and 390 were found to have normal speech. The details of clients with speech and language disorders along with the category of disorders are given in table 9 and figure 2.

A new audiometric block, the Sri Jayachamaraja block, was set up to cater to the growing number of patients for audiological evaluation and management at the Institute. Central Public Works Department, Govt. of India, constructed the building at a cost of Rs. 4 crores, and it has a total plinth area of 767 Sq m. There are 21 rooms equipped with infrastructure to test 21 patients at a time. The building has dedicated blocks for pediatric and geriatric patients with independent patient waiting areas. All the rooms are acoustically treated and have state-ofthe-art equipment that meets international standards.





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Audiological assessment and rehabilitation

Hearing Evaluation: The hearing evaluation section of the Department of Audiology specializes in assessment of the hearing abilities of the individuals. During the reporting year, the Section evaluated 14762 by administering various audiological tests such as pure tone audiometry, speech audiometry and otoacoustic emission and threshold-equalizing noise test. Totally, 29524 ears were diagnosed with different degrees of hearing loss including severe (4959) and profound (4605) cases. Further, different types of hearing loss such as sensori neural loss, mixed, conductive, auditory processing disorders and auditory dys-synchrony were identified during the evaluation. The details of hearing evaluation and diagnosis are given in Table 12 and figures 3-6.






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

Referred Evaluation-1 Psychological Assessment and Rehabilitation

Psychological assessment was carried out for the deserving cases with communication disorders registered at the institute by the Department of Clinical Psychology. This includes pre-vocational assessment for adolescent/adults with communication disorders, neuro-psychological evaluations for individuals with neuro-linguistic /communication problems, psycho-educational achievement testing and grade level assessment for children with scholastic backwardness and academic under achievement and behavior assessment for children with problem behaviors/skill deficits. In addition, family assessment was done on specific cases requiring family intervention programmes.

Psychological assessment of 5485 new and 925 review cases was done at the clinic during the reporting year. This includes 165 cases from Hindi region. The new cases include patients with mental retardation (2095), expressive language disorders (1182), Average intelligence (725), learning disability (663), stuttering (507), misarticulation (239), aphasia (53), autism (32), cerebral palsy (43), functional voice disorders (5), voice problem (13) and others (853). The details are given in figure 8.





Celebration of World Voice Day

The World Voice Day, an annual event celebrated with an objective to reveal the importance of voice in our daily lives as a tool of communication, was celebrated at the Institute with the theme 'Voice Matters' on 16th April, 2014 under the aegis of the Professional Voice Care Unit, Department of Speech-Language Sciences. The different events included were orientation program for prospective teachers (B.Ed. students), writing an article in Kannada and other competitions. Around 70 B.Ed. students and seven faculty members from the Government College of Teacher Education, Nazarbad, Mysore participated in the orientation program. A short movie making competition was organized for the students of Speech & Hearing from diploma to post-doctoral level on the theme. The general publics were made aware of voice care by publishing an article on the topic in The Hindu national daily on 16th April.

Launching of Assistive Device for Museum Visitors with Hearing Impairment

An assistive device for museum visitors with hearing impairment was designed and developed by the Department of Electronics of the Institute. Prof. Gautam Biswas, Director, Indian Institute of Technology, Guwahati launched the device on 9th August, 2014 in the presence of Dr. A. K. Panda, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India, Prof. Sudesh Mukhopadhya, Chairperson, Rehabilitation Council of India and Dr. S.R. Savithri, Director of the Institute. Basically developed for the visitors at Regional Museum of Natural History, Mysore , it is compatible with the hearing aids worn by persons with mild, moderate, severe or profound hearing loss, in tele-coil mode of operation.

Referred Evaluation-2 Otorhinolaryngological Assessment & Rehabilitation

The Otorhino-laryngological assessment and rehabilitation for persons with communication disorders are being carried out at the Department of Otorhinolaryngology. In addition to the clinical services provided at the Institute, the Department staff render diagnostic, therapeutic and surgical services at K.R. Hospital, Mysore Medical College.

Totally, 19011 new and 18491 review cases were examined during the reporting year at the institute and 6105 microscopic, 330 stroboscopic /endoscopic, 115 vertigo, 71 oto endoscopic and 55 diagnostic naso endoscopic examinations were carried out. Also, 7262 new and 5197 review cases were examined and 86 major and 56 minor surgeries were successfully carried out at K.R.Hospital. The details of diagnostic services provided are given in table 18.




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Specialized Clinical Services

The institute provided a variety of specialized clinical services for individuals with communication disorders during the reporting year at the following clinical units.

Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) Unit: The AAC unit supported, enhanced and provided alternative methods of communication for individuals who are non-verbal. The unit evaluated 56 new cases in 58 sessions and 259 therapy cases in 1563 sessions during the reporting year. It also attended 17 demonstration therapy and 4 home training cases. In addition, 43 PG students of the institute were given training in 117 sessions. The details of AAC evaluation are given in figure 9.





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Otorhinolaryngological Assessment

Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD)

Unit: Assessment and treatment were provided for 337 clients with autism spectrum disorders at the ASD unit during the reporting year. Of them, 50 were from Hindi region. The unit also attended 766 therapy and 95 demonstration therapy cases. Thirty one therapy cases discharged and 16 discontinued during the period. The total number of therapy sessions conducted was 4589.

The occupational therapy section of the unit evaluated 74 cases in 64 sessions. There were 173 therapy cases and 27 Demonstration Therapy cases. Totally, 643 therapy sessions were carried out. Five cases were discharged, one discontinued and 18 re-evaluated.

Clinic for Adult and Elderly Persons with Language Disorders

(CAEPLD): CAEPLD provides clinical services to adult and elderly persons. Totally, seventeen clients were evaluated in the clinic during the reporting year.

Fluency Unit: This unit catered to the needs of persons with stuttering and other fluency disorders and provided clinical services to 634 (549 new cases and 45 review cases) persons with fluency disorders during the reporting year.

Implantable Hearing Devices

Unit: The activities of this unit include selection of candidates, mapping/programming, trouble shooting of implantable hearing devices such as cochlear implant, bone anchored hearing aids and middle ear implants. Rehabilitation of individuals using such devices was also undertaken. During the reporting year, 99 clients were seen in the unit. Totally 105 mapping and 72 unaided/aided audiograms for Cochlear Implants were done. In addition, 52 bone anchored hearing aids were tried and 49 Cochlear Implant devices trouble shooted. Also, 69 cochlear implant clients were counseled in 88 sessions.




Figure 10: Activities of LDC

Learning Disability Clinic: The

objectives of the clinic include early identification of students with learning disability, undertake their detailed evaluation by a multi-disciplinary team of experts, plan individualized remediation programmes for the identified students, serve as nodal center for issue of certificates for certain educational concessions, conduct action research to facilitate advocacy, policy change and public education and develop related literature/ materials for or about students with learning disabilities. The details of the activities carried out at the clinic during the reporting year are given in figure 10.


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Listening Training (LT) Unit : The unit is committed to provide aural rehabilitation to the clients who use hearing aid and cochlear implant devices and to the persons suffering from (central) auditory processing disorder, tinnitus and hyperacusis. Totally 3165, persons underwent listening training comprising of 13294 sessions during the reporting year. The detailed statistics on listening training activities are given in table 19 and figure 11.

Neuropsychology Unit

The services offered in the unit includes the assessment of specific function of the brain through standard individualized test, detailed assessment of lobular functions through standardized batteries and rehabilitation through paper pencil techniques or through computer assisted packages. Totally, 21 neuropsychological assessments, 12 neuropsychological rehabilitation and 07 home based neuropsychological rehabilitation were made during the reporting year in the unit.

Professional Voice Care (PVC) Unit

The unit provided specialized assessment and management services to professional voice users during the reporting year. It organized various programs to orient and sensitize professional voice users on care, maintenance and conservation of voice. The unit imparted clinical services to 13 clients during the reporting year.

Structural Orofacial Anomalies (U- SOFA) Unit:




Figure 13: U-SOFA Evaluation

Clients with deformalities in the growth of head and facial bones were given multi-disciplinary diagnostic and rehabilitation services in the clinic. Totally 163, clients were evaluated at the clinic by the experts. The detailed clinical statistics of the unit are given in table 21 and figures 12 and 13.

Figure 12: U-SOFA Diagnosis

Swallowing Disorders' Unit: This is a new unit opened in the Department of Speech-Language Pathology to facilitate assessment and management of persons with swallowing disorders with state-of-the-art equipment. Totally, 4 intervention service was carried out during the reporting year.

Vertigo Clinic: The Vertigo clinic offered comprehensive care in evaluation and management of patients with vertigo. A multidisciplinary team comprising of ENT surgeon, neurologist and audiologist evaluated 115 patients in the clinic for both peripheral and central vertigo during the reporting year and diagnostic tests like microscopic examination of ear, electro nystagmography, vestibulo spinal tests, neurological evaluation, video nystagmography, audiological tests and vestibular evoked myogenic potential test were carried out for the needy ones. Also, 29 followup cases were attended.

Voice Clinic: This clinic offered evaluation and management services to persons of all ages with voice disorders. During the reporting year, 403 clients with voice disorders were evaluated in the clinic using video stroboscopy and software for voice assessment.



FINE-YEAR KEY STATISTIGS




Figure 14: Medical specialty and allied health

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Medical Specialty & Allied Health Services : The institute facilitated the services of various medical specialists such as pediatrician, neurologist, plastic surgeon, prosthodontist, orthodontist, phono-surgeon and services of allied health professionals such as physiotherapist and occupational therapist, to the needy clients. Totally, 845 patients underwent occupational therapy in 5931 sessions and 819 underwent physiotherapy in 7234 sessions, during the reporting year. In addition, 771, 325, 202, 60, 12 and 125 clients consulted neurologist, pediatrician, plastic surgeon, ortho-dontist, prosthodontist and phono-surgeon, respectively. The details are given in figure 14.

Observation of International Stuttering Awareness Day

International Stuttering Awareness Day was observed at the Institute on 28th October, 2014 by organizing an orientation program to create awareness on characteristic features, causes, myths and facts and role of teachers/others in the identification of stuttering. Dr. Asha Yathiraj, Director In-charge inaugurated the programme. Totally, sixty five teacher trainees from different DEd. And BEd.colleges, 25 Anganawadi supervisors and 10 persons with stuttering participated in the programme. A pre and post test was conducted. Ms.Sangeetha Mahesh, Clinical Lecturer coordinated the program under the guidance of Dr. Yeshoda, K, Head, Department of Clinical Services.



Observation of National Cerebral Palsy Day

National Cerebral Palsy day was observed at the Institute by organizing a multi-specialty camp on 24-25 November, 2014 for children with cerebral palsy. A team of professionals including speech-language pathologists, ophthalmologists, dentists, nutritionists, and social worker assessed the children and provided guidance to the parents. Totally, 122 children with the disorder attended the camp. Dr. S.R. Savithri, the Director inaugurated the camp and Ms. Prajwala, Clinical Dietician,

Ashwini Diabetic Care Center, Mysore released a brochure in English and Kannada on Handling Feeding Problems in Children with Communication Disorders. Multimedia and print resources on cerebral palsy and associated problems in children with CP were displayed and disseminated among the parents who attended the programme. A follow up on vision disorders in children who attended the camp was held on 18-19 December, 2014 under the coordination of Dr. N. Swapna, Reader in Speech Pathology.

Special Educational Services

In order to achieve the mission of mainstreaming Children with Special Needs, various services such as Special Educational Assessment Unit (SEA-U), Parent Infant Program (PIP), Preschool Parent Empowerment Program (PPEP), Preschool Program, Preschool Bridge Course (PBC), Individualized Education Program (IEP), Curricular Support Services (CSS), Non formal education (NFE), Demonstration Educational Training (DET) and Guidance and Counseling to children with communication disorders and their caregivers are provided. In addition, parents / caregivers are empowered to manage children with special needs through training for parallel teaching in preschool. Practical training is also provided to them in developing special teaching-learning material for children with communication disorders. Also, basic literacy and computer literacy program are also provided. The activities are being carried out by the pre-school functioning under the aegis of the Department of Special Education. The details of the various services /activities carried out during the reporting year are given below.

Pre-school Training: Totally 231 children with communication disorders underwent preschool training in 43700 sessions during the reporting year. The training was given in two batches during the periods April-November, 2014 and December, 2014-March, 2015. They were provided with curricular training as well as training in co-curricular activities such as yoga, drama, music and craft works. Special educational services provided are shown in table 22.



Observation of International Day of Persons with Disability

The Institute celebrated the International Day of Persons with Disabilities on 3rd December, 2014. A public function for caregivers/stakeholders/staffs/ representatives of voluntary organizations was organized on the occasion. Dr. K. C. units on 5th March, 2015. Dr. S.R. Savithri, the Director was present. SEAU is dedicated to carry out the special educational assessment in children with special needs and USAFE to solve their sensory problems.




Unit of Sensory Adaptation for Education

Preschool Graduation Day

Preschool Graduation Day was conducted on 25th April, 2014. Mr. B.N Shivarame Gowda, Block Education Officer, South Zone, Mysore was the chief guest and Dr. S.R. Savithri, Director presided over. Eighty one preschool children who successfully completed preschool training from the Department of Special Education were felicitated during the event. Ninety six percentages of the children got mainstreamed and 4% got admissions in special schools.

Parent Infant Program

In order to facilitate all-round development of children with special needs in the age group of newborns to 2.5 years, a Parent Infant Program was launched at the Pre-school, attached to the Department of Special Education. Prof. Sudesh Mukhopadhya, Chairperson, Rehabilitation Council of India inaugurated the program on 9th August, 2014. Dr. A. K. Panda, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India, Prof. Gautam Biswas, Director, Indian Institute of Technology, Guwahati, Dr.Shekarjit Singh, Director, Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal and Dr. S.R. Savithri, Director of the Institute were present. The programme aims to improve the physical, cognitive, communication, social/ emotional skills of the special children with the support of their parents.

Clinical Support Services

The institute extended a diverse range of support services to patients and their family. These include the following.

Distribution and Repairing of Hearing Aids: Electro-acoustic evaluation, management and repair of hearing aids were carried out under the aegis of Department of Electronics. Totally 4286 hearing aids with solar battery chargers were distributed at the main campus (3314), camps (831), and clinical outreach centers (141), after electro-acoustic evaluation and testing under ADIP scheme. Under AIISH Hearing Aid Dispensing Scheme, 1831 hearing aids were issued at concessional rate. Also, 30673 hearing aid spares were issued. In addition, the department repaired 577 body level and 738 BTE hearing aids.

Counseling and Guidance: The professional experts of the Institute provided counseling and guidance on various aspects of the disorders such as treatment procedures, usage and care of tools like hearing aids during the reporting year.

Distribution of Toy Kits: 115 toy kits were distributed to eligible disabled children worth Rs, 86250.



Clinical Observership

Mr. Rajath Salegame, 3280 Cool Springs Court Naperville, IL, 60564 (US.A.) was provided with observership at the Department of Clinical Services from 23rd December 2014 to 2nd January 2015. He was oriented about the objectives of the institute and the department along with the functions to begin with. As an observer he witnessed the clinical activities/ functions such as students taking case history of clients with hearing impairment, aphasia associated with dysarthria, cleft palate, stuttering, and voice disorder, staff doing quantitative assessments for a client with complaint of voice problems using instruments/ software, functioning of a specialized clinical units, staff conducting practical teaching for the B.Sc. (Sp. & Hg.) students. He interacted with the students and got to know about the programme, their interests/ inclinations, their passion for the field and their reasons for choosing Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology for career building.

IDUTREACH SERVICES

n addition to the diagnostic and therapeutic services provided within its walls, the institute carries out various outreach services on communication and its disorders in different parts of the country. The major outreach services during the reporting year are given below.

Communication Disorder Screening Programmes

The Institute conducted screening programmes for communication disorders in different settings and localities. The individuals participating in the programmes were checked for speech, language and hearing abilities and provided with diagnostic and therapeutic services. The screening programmes conducted in different settings are mentioned in the following pages

Newborn/Infant Screening

This programme focuses on screening neonates and infants who are at risk for communication disorders using various tools such as High Risk Register for communication disorders, Behavioral Observation Audiometry, Oto Acoustic Emission Screening and Screening Checklists. During the reporting year, screening programme was carried out at 15 hospitals and three immunization centres in Mysore, six Outreach Service Centres of the Institute functioning in different parts of Karnataka and three Newborn Screening Centres functioning in hospitals attached with the AIISH DHLS centres, at Sriram Chandra Bhanj Medical College & Hospital, Cuttuck, Odisha, Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal, Manipur and Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Ajmer, Rajasthan and a total of 26334 new borns were screened. Of these, 5318 new borns (20.19%) were at risk for communication disorders. The details are given in table 24.

Of these, 380 children underwent follow-up evaluation in all the centres. They were administered a complete test battery.

Industrial Screening

Hearing evaluation of industrial workers, were carried out for the employees working in Karnataka Silk Industries Company (KSIC), Mysore. One forty three ears of the 117 employees screened were found to have hearing impairment on administration of complete audiological test battery. The persons with hearing impairment were given rehabilitation services.

In addition to the services provided at their work settings, the industrial workers were encouraged to undergo hearing evaluation at the Institute clinical settings. Totally, 245 employees working with KSIC, Rane Madras and Bhaba Atomic Research Centre availed clinical service at the Institute during the report year and 282 (57.5%) ears had hearing impairment. All the employees were counseled on the importance of hearing protection devices and the need for using it regularly in noisy conditions to protect their hearing ability.

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School Screening


Nursery and primary school students of various Schools in Mysore and Tumkur districts were screened for communication disorder as a part of the school screening program during the reporting year. Totally 5247 students were screened and among them 1052 (20.04%) were identified with ear related disorders, 67 (1.27%) with hearing loss and 563 (10.72%) with speech-language disorders. They were recommended for follow-up at the Institute.

Elderly Screening

Speech, language and hearing evaluations were carried out for elderly citizens residing in different old age homes in Mysore. One hundred and seventy persons underwent evaluations. Of these 73 (42.94%) had hearing problems, 4 (2.35%)speech problems, and 24(14.11%) multiple disorders.

Rashtriya Bal Swashya Karyakram

The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India has launched the Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK), Child Health Screening and Early Intervention Services under the National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) in the country and the Institute has been recognized as a collaborative organization for the program. In this connection, a 10 days refresher course on National Consultation of Speech Pathologists and Audiologists was conducted at the Institute with the objective of updating the knowledge of the Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists in prevention, early identification and intervention of communication disorders in children from 22nd December, 2014 to 31st December, 2014. Totally, 32 participants from across the country attended the program.

Survey of Communication Disorders

A survey of communication disorders by trained ASHA workers is going on as a part of an AIISH funded research project worth Rs. 48.23 lakhs in the districts of Mysore, Mandya and Chamarajanagara. In this regard, training for 77 ASHA workers was conducted on the topic Identification of Hearing and Speech and Language Disorders at the Institute. During the reporting year, the ASHA workers screened 84,033 persons staying in 17,253 households in 135 villages in Srirangapatna taluk, Mandya and 1419 among those screened were identified with various types of communication disorders. Totally, 157 were referred for Speech and Language therapy at the Institute and 15 attended the therapy.

Camp based Screening



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
Clinical Services at the Outreach Service Centres

Diagnostic and therapeutic services on communication disorders were provided at the four Outreach Service Centres of the institute located in sub-divisional taluk hospital at Sagara taluk, Shivamoga and the Primary Health Centres at Hullahalli, Mysuru, Akkihebbalu, Mandya

and Gumballi, Chamarajanagara. Totally, 2111 persons availed the services the details are given in table 26. Thirty six persons (1.70%) identified with speech-language disorders underwent therapy in 303 sessions. Also, 142 hearing aids were distributed among the persons identified with hearing impairment.






Tele-Intervention and Tele-Assessment Services




Figure 15: Tele-intervention through videoconferencing




Figure 16: Tele-intervention through skye

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Tele-Educational Guidance and Counseling

Educational guidance and counseling were given to 8 parents of children with communication disorders at the DHLS centres through videoconferencing and Skype on various topics related to the education of children with special needs and on the government sponsored beneficiary schemes.

Mainstream School Adoption

In order to ensure proper care for the children with communication disorders, studying in normal schools, a mainstream school adoption programme was initiated and 6 schools were adopted and 70 teachers in these schools were oriented on identification of special needs in children, curricular adaptation and management of their special educational needs in the inclusive learning environments.

Itinerant Service

The Institute offered itinerant service on prevention and control of communication disorders for the regular school and Anganwaadi children through the Itinerant Speech Therapist and Medical Social Worker. The service was provided at 32 schools and 22 Anganwaadis in Mysore district and 129 children identified with various types communication disorders were referred to AIISH for evaluation, and 185 teachers/ Anganwaadi workers were oriented on prevention and control of communication disorders during the reporting year. In addition, follow-up of 77 regular school children availing therapy at AIISH were carried out, 61 teachers and 13 parents oriented and 54 parents counseled on school placement.

PUBLIC EDUCATION

The institute has been taking various steps to make the common man aware of communication disorders, educate them on prevention of the disorders and provide guidance and counseling to persons suffering from such disorders. The major public education activities carried out during the reporting year are the following.

Monthly Public Lectures

In order to create public awareness on various communication disorders such as stuttering, articulation disorders, aphasia, mental retardation, hearing and voice problems, the institute organized monthly public lectures tailored for common man, throughout the year, during which expert professionals working in the institute delivered one-hour lecture followed by question and answer session with the audience. The details of the lectures delivered during the reporting year are given in table 29.



Organization of Street Play and Awareness Rallies





Figure 17: Public Orientation Programmes



Other Activities and Events

Other activities that are being carried out at the Institute include infrastructure development, library and information services, material development activities, personnel management and technological consultancy services. The details of the activities carried out during the reporting year are given below.

Infrastructure Development and Maintenance

The infrastructure development and maintenance activities of the institute are being carried out mainly by the Department of Electronics, and the Engineering and Horticulture sections.

Electronic and I.T. Infrastructure

Audio Visual System for the Seminar Hall, Knowledge Park: State of the art Audio-Visual systems was set up in the newly inaugurated Knowledge Park with HDMI quality multimedia projectors and world class audio amplification system. The entire audio visual system was digitally integrated and controlled with touch panel control system.

Infrastructure for Smart Classrooms, Knowledge Park : Smart classrooms were setup in the Knowledge park with wireless slate coupled with a document camera, high end multimedia projector, computer workstations, integrated projector controller and digital audio system. The new system will provide state-of-the

art ICT assistance to all the faculty and students and will enhance the quality of teaching learning process at the institute.

Computer & Telephone Network : Three new buildings – Knowledge park, Jayachamarajendra Block and Type II and III quarters were networked to the existing data and voice networks of the institute. Necessary systems were added to the local area network and telephone network to incorporate this. All the buildings were linked through optical fiber to the server room. In addition, the Knowledge park was equipped with Wi-Fi connectivity.

Upgradation of Computer Network : The last phase of upgradation of the campus network from 10/100 Mbps to 10/100/1000 Mbps was completed during the reporting year. The entire network is equipped with stateof-the art manageable network switches. The upgraded network will cater to the ever increasing data communication and information transfer demands of the institute, more effectively.

New Electrical Substation with 1000 kVA Capacity : To cater to the increased power demand at the institute, the existing 22 kVA electrical substation was upgraded to 1000 kVA capacity. The new substation is equipped with state-of –the art systems such as OLTC transformer, automatic power factor compensation unit and world class safety and protection systems.

Civil Engineering Infrastructure

The institute spent Rs. 51,33,600/- towards civil engineering infrastructure maintenance during the reporting year. The major maintenance activities completed include installing solar water heating system in ladies hostel, renovation of guest house and old administrative building and painting to stone masonry compound wall & grills. In addition, construction of Centre of Excellence and Speech and Hearing Museum buildings were initiated

Garden and Landscape Development

The Horticulture Section has been carrying out the development and maintenance of gardens, lawns and other landscaping works in the institute campus. The gardens spread across the campus are enriched with herbs, shrubs, climbers, creepers and trees of perennial nature. The major activities carried out by the section during the period include propagation and development of various species of plants, development of Bermuda lawn and hedges in various localities in the campus, planting of banana suckers and fixing of Mexican turf. In addition, the routine maintenance works such as watering, mowing of lawn, weeding, sweeping, hoeing, clipping of hedges, pruning of trees and shrubs, top dressing of garden area with manure, spray of pesticides/insecticides, application of inorganic fertilizers and removal of garden waste were carried out.

The Institute participated in the Dasara flower show 2014, conducted by the Dept. of Horticulture, Govt. of Karnataka and won first prize for arranging different plant groups. It also won five first prizes for well garden maintenance and growing various flowers in pots and beds.

Library and Information Services

The following library and Information services were carried out during the reporting year.

Acquisition of Information Resources : Totally, 552 print books were purchased during the reporting year making the total collection to 20328. 
The newly opened Staff Quarters



Personnel Management


