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

#### **Foreword**

It is my privilege to present the 52<sup>nd</sup> Annual Report of the All India Institute of Speech and Hearing, Mysuru. This report contains the activities of the institute for the year 2016-17.

The Institute continued its activities in manpower generation, research, clinical services, and public education in the field of communication disorders in the current year and launched a number of new facilities/ services including a web-based software for managing clinical data launched by Dr. B. N. Gangadhara, Director, National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences, Bengaluru and a full-fledged research

facility for audiological research called Facility for Advanced Auditory Research (FAAR) launched by Dr. V. Prakash, former Director, Central Food Technology Research Institute, Mysuru. Also, a phonology Clinic was inaugurated.

The 56<sup>th</sup> Executive Council meeting was held on 9<sup>th</sup> November 2016 under the Chairmanship of Shri J P Nadda, Hon'ble Minister for Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India and the 47<sup>th</sup> Finance Committee meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Shri Sanjeeva Kumar, IAS, Additional Secretary (Health), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, New Delhi on 8<sup>th</sup> February 2017. Selection committee meeting was also held on the same day under the Chairmanship of Shri Sanjeeva Kumar, IAS, Additional Secretary (Health), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, New Delhi.

The institute initiated ISO 8001:2015 with a workshop for the staff. A one-day International Workshop on Advancements in Audiometric Calibration on 13th September, 2016 for audiologists and other professionals working in the area of communication disorders with Sri. Peter Dolenc, an international expert in calibration from Bruel and Kjaer (B & K), Denmark as resource person was also organized. In collaboration with IEEE special interest group on communication disability, the Institute organized an Assistive Technology Hackathon on 24th September, 2016 with an objective of encouraging engineering students / faculty to undertake projects related to development of assistive technology for persons with communication disorders. Several innovative ideas such as HOBOT for the disabled, eye and neck movement based communication system for individuals with paralysis were presented in the hackathon. The Institute in collaboration with Alzheimer's and Related Disorders Society of India, Mysuru Chapter, Department of Psychiatry, Mysre Medical College and Research Institute, Mysuru, Department of Psychiatry, JSS Medical College, Mysuru and the Foundation for Research & Advocacy in Mental Health, Mysuru organized the 20th Annual National Conference of the Alzheimer's and Related Disorders Society of India (ARDSI-2016) on 10-11 December, 2016. Also, in collaboration with the Swartz Centre for Computational Neuroscience, a center of the Institute for Neural Computation of the University of California San Diego, USA organized a workshop on Construction and Analysis of Experiments in Human Neurophysiology EEGLAB on 16-20 January, 2017. Mr. Scott Makeig and Mr. Arnaud Delorme, the main developers of EEGLAB, University of California, San Diego, served as the resource persons for the workshop. Dr. Subhash Chandra Parija, Director, Jawaharlal Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education and Research, Puducherry was the Chief Guest. Further, the Institute facilitated the National Program on Prevention and Control of Deafness (NPPCD) of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India by conducting Level 1 - Sensitization and Awareness of Doctors and Audiologists at the Medical College level for prevention, early identification and management of hearing impaired and deafness cases.

The Graduation Day was organized for the first time in the Institute on 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2016. Dr. H. Vinod Bhat, Vice-Chancellor, Manipal University, Manipal delivered the Graduation Day address. Dr. H. R. Nagendra, Chancellor, Swami Vivekananda Yoga Research Foundation, Bengaluru and Dr. N. Rathna, former Director of the institute graced the function. On the occasion, graduation certificates were distributed to 110 graduate, postgraduate and diploma students, and the rank holders and PhD awardees were felicitated.

The Institute conducted 16 academic programmes to admit students to Diploma, bachelors, masters, doctoral programmes. A total of 364 students were admitted to various programmes in 2016-17 through national level entrance examinations. The Institute provided stipend and fellowship to all eligible students

pursuing various academic programmes at the Institute during 2016-17. In addition, the Institute offered 187 orientation/short-term training programmes on communication disorders.

During the reporting year, the staff of the institute completed 24 research projects and 31 new research projects were initiated. In addition, 28 research projects were ongoing. Eight candidates were awarded Ph.D., 2 candidates submitted the Ph. D. thesis, and 45 candidates were pursuing doctoral studies. In addition, 64 students submitted their master's dissertation and 61 candidates were pursuing their master's dissertation. One hundred and twenty nine scientific papers were presented in international and national conferences/ seminars and 123 scientific articles were published in peer-reviewed international and national journals and 53 in In-house journals. Also, 30 chapters in books/ books were written by the staff of the institute.

The institute registered 69,490 clients with communication disorders. 55162 new borns were screened for communication disorders in 21 hospitals in Mysore, outreach service centres, and in 7 states – Karnataka, Rajasthan, Manipur, Madhya Pradesh, Pondicherry, Jharkhand and Orissa. Industrial screening was done for the 425 employees; 2743 children in schools of Mysore, and 101 elderly were screened. 3883 clients in 35 camps were screened in various parts of the country. 2630 clients were catered to in the outreach service centres of the institute at 4 PHCs located in districts of Mysore. Tele intervention was done 61 clients with communication disorders. Totally 774 hearing aids with solar battery chargers were distributed.

As a part of a project, a total of 5,73,117 persons were surveyed in specific hoblis of three districts of Mysuru to identify persons with communication disorders. One auxiliary nurse midwife, 88 Anganwadi teachers and 391 ASHA workers performed the survey during the reporting year. Training was conducted for the personnel deputed for carrying out the survey before mobilizing them to the villages/towns. The Institute released the first report on the survey which revealed a prevalence of 2.46% of communication disorders.

Nine monthly public lectures were held and 38 public educational materials were prepared. The Institute had a tableau portraying noise pollution at the Dasara Procession, which won the first prize. The Institute also participated in 17<sup>th</sup> National Jambore organized by the Bharath Scouts & Guides from 30<sup>th</sup> December, 2016 to 4<sup>th</sup> January, 2017 by installing a stall.

The institute procured several scientific instruments, e-books and bibliographical databases. The institute received कार्यालय darpana स्मृतरचिन्हपुरस्कार and कार्यालयज्योतिस्मृतरचिन्हपुरस्कार hosted by the Raj Bhasha Sansthan, New Delhi. Dr. S. R. Savithri, Director was honored Rajbhasha Shree Puraskar. The Institute was awarded with I Prize for Rajbhasha Anupalan (Region C). Dr. H. P. Umasaraswathi, H.T, received the best paper by the Rajbhasha Samsthan. The Horticulture Section participated in the Dasara Horticultural Flower Show, 2016, organized by the Department of Horticulture, Govt. of Karnataka and won many prizes. The Institute staff won several awards at conferences/ seminars. The Government of Karnataka gave 10 acres of land at Varuna Hobli to the Institute. The building work of Centre of Excellence is almost completed and is expected to be initiated in the next academic year.

Overall the year 2016-17 was gratifying. I extend my gratitude and heartfelt thanks to all my colleagues and the officers at the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India who have supported for the cause of progress of the Institute.

A full-fledoed research facility for audiological research called Facility for Advanced Auditory Research (FAAR) was inaugurated on 9h August, 2016 by Dr. V. Prakash. former Director, Central Food Technology Research Institute, Mysuru. The facility is envisaged to advance our understanding of the human auditory system and to remediate its dysfunction. It houses a series of labs, which specialize in various domains of auditory research. The labs. Include; Electrical Brain Imaging lab, Opchisor Machanics Lab, Speech Perception Lab, Audio-Visual Lab, Hearing Device Research Lab, Balance Research Lab, Basic Hearing Assessment Lab and the Central Data Lab conceived to carry out both basic and applied research to understand the auditory system and its disorders from behavioral, psychoacoustic and physiological perspectives.

#### **Audio-Visual Laboratory**



With the aim of supporting development of quality digital resource materials for tele-services and also to preserve audio-visual materials acquired over the years through tale rehabilitation services, an audio-visual laboratory was opened at the Tale Centre for Persons with Communication Disorders. #### **Admission and Enrolment**

National level entrance examinations were conducted to admit students to Bachelors in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology (B.ASLP), M.Sc. (Audiology) and M.Sc. (Speech-Language Pathology) on 11th June, 2016. Totally, 1173 candidates appeared for the B.ASLP entrance examination held in

different parts of the country. Entrance Examinations to M.Sc. (Audiology) and M.Sc. (Speech-Language Pathology) held at the institute campus in Mysuru were attended by 194 and 160 candidates, respectively. Admission to the Diploma, and Bachelor of Special Education programmes were done based on the merit obtained in the qualifying examinations.




Figure 1: Student Admission




Figure 2: Country/State/UT-wise distribution of admission

#### **Academic Performance**




Figure 3: Academic Performance



# RESEARCH



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

### **CLINICAL CARE**

### **Patient Registration**

Totally 69,490 persons were registered for availing clinical services at the institute during the reporting year. This includes 22,469 new and 47,021 review cases. The geographical and gender details of new clients are given in table 1. Majority of them (20953) were from Karnataka, the state in which the institute is located, followed by the neighboring states of Kerala (853), Andhra Pradesh (209) and Tamil Nadu (194). There were 13 clients from north-east region. In addition, there were 12 foreign clients from across the world. Males (13510) outnumbered females (8959) in availing clinical services.

Totally, 12970 persons with various communication disorders availed speech-language therapy, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, listening training and other special clinic therapies in 74,628 sessions.

### **Speech and Language Assessment and Rehabilitation**

The speech and language outpatient unit evaluated 7501 clients which includes 5819 new and 1682 review cases. Of the new cases, 5670 were identified with various kinds of speech and language disorders and 149 were found to have normal speech. The details of various speech and language disorders diagnosed are given in table 2 and figure 1.



### **Audiological Assessment and Rehabilitation**

**Hearing Evaluations** were carried out on individuals who complained of hearing problems. In outpatient department a total of 16,409 clients were assessed. Hearing evaluations were carried out on 14,555 individuals at Jayachamaraja Block in Clinical services. Different types of audiological evaluations carried out were Auditory Brainstem Responses (3,940), Behavioural Observation Audiometry (621), Immittance evaluation (13,970), Otoacoustic emissions (3,648), Pure Tone Audiometry (13,751), Speech Audiometry (13,701), Tinnitus evaluation (345), Vestibular evoked Myogenic potentials (63), Visual Reinforcement Audiometry (185), Video Head Impulse Test (30) and Late Latency Response (16).

Based on these audiological tests different degrees of hearing loss were diagnosed. Ears with normal hearing were 5,003 and ears with different degrees of hearing loss were 24,107. The numbers of ears with different degrees of hearing loss were: 2381 in minimal, 3121 in mild, 4204 in moderate, 3818 in moderately severe, 4287 in severe, 4036 in profound, 35 in minimal to mild, 357 in mild to moderate, 283 in moderate to moderately severe, 437 in moderately severe to severe, 1110 in severe to profound and 38 in moderate to severe categories. The ears with sloping configuration of hearing loss were 737.

Of the ears tested, there were 2879 ears with conductive hearing loss, 4598 ears with mixed hearing loss and 7394 ears with sensorineural hearing loss. There were 1503 clients with unilateral hearing loss and 11284 with bilateral hearing loss. The other conditions identified include Auditory Processing Disorders (16), auditory dys-synchrony (127) and functional hearing loss (120).

Hearing aid trial and prescription were carried out for clients in need for amplification and/or assistive listening devices. Clients evaluated of hearing aids were 7509 and 5397 hearing aids were prescribed at AIISH. Twenty nine hearing aids were prescribed for exchange. Clients recommended for auditory training were 1136 and for speech reading were 217. Aided/unaided audiograms and Visual Reinforcement Audiometry were done on 1085 and 106 individuals respectively. A total of 3175 digital

hearing alds were programmed. Insertion gain measurements were carried out on 9 individuals and electroacoustic characteristics of 60 hearing alds were measured. Recommendations for retrial with custom ear molds and ear plugs were 2052 and 22 respectively. In four individuals Assistive Listening Devices were trialed. The clients evaluated at camps for certificate were 149 and clients referred to AIISH were 61.

At Ear mould lab, ear impressions were taken for 4612 clients. Ear impressions were taken for 2007 new and 2024 old clients at AIISH and 581 in community based camps. The total number of ears for which sar impression were taken was 7294. Ear moulds given for free of cost were 1309, for payment were 5058, for clients from camp were 642 and for impressions received under Central Prosthetic Lab activities were 85. Different types of ear moulds made were hard regular moulds (731), hard shall moulds (3), soft moulds (3891) and soft canal moulds (330). Ear impressions taken for In-the Canal hearing alds were 63 and for ear blocking were 58. Swimmers ear plugs made of hard acrylic and soft allicon material were 10 and 92 respectively. Ear moulds for which sound tube were replaced were 1163 and ear moulds isoquered were 340. Total revenus generated for the year 2016-17 from ear mould lab

was 10,60,340.




Figure 2: Age wise audiological assessment

Age-wise statistics of clients seen in Hearing Evaluation, Hearing Aid Trial & Counseling sections and Ear Mold inboratory are given in table 5 and figure 2. Audiological assessment and rehabilitation services were also provided at the eight DHLS centres of the Institute located in different parts of the country, the details of which are given in table 6.

# Referred Evaluation-1: Psychological Assessment and Rehabilitation

Psychological assessment was carried out for the referred cases registered at the Department of Clinical Psychology. This includes pre-vocational assessment for adolescent/ adults with communication disorders, neuro-psychological evaluation for individuals with neuro-linguistic/communication problems, psycho-educational achievement testing and grade level assessment for children with scholastic backwardness and academic under achievement and behavior assessment for children with problem behaviors/skill deficits. In addition, family assessment was done on specific cases requiring family intervention programmes.

Psychological assessment of 5149 new and 1194 repeat cases was done at the Department during the reporting year. This includes 201 cases from Hindi region. The new cases include patients with mental retardation (1831 nos.), specific developmental disorders of scholastic skills (856 nos.), stuttering (424 nos.), expressive language disorders (411 nos.), other disorders of psychological development (408 nos.), receptive language disorder (285 nos.), specific speech articulation disorder (242 nos.), pervasive

developmental disorders (18 nos.), dissociative motor disorders (6 nos.) and other disorders (357 nos.).

The psychological rehabilitation provided includes behavior therapy (215 cases in 419 sessions), home based training program for MR/SLD (15 cases in 28 sessions), remedial training for SLD cases (11 cases in 28 sessions), cognitive behavior therapy (9 cases in 37 sessions), voice therapy (2 cases in 4 sessions) and parent counseling for all the cases.



### Referred Evaluation-2: Otolaryngological Assessment and Rehabilitation

The Otolaryngological assessment and rehabilitation for persons with communication disorders are being carried out at the Department of Otolaryngology. In addition to the clinical services provided at the Institute, the Department staff render diagnostic, therapeutic and surgical services at K.R. Hospital, Mysore Medical College, Mysore.

Totally, 18172 new and 20237 review cases were examined during the reporting year at the institute, and 6280 microscopic, 287 stroboscopic / endoscopic examination, 149 vertigo, 158 oto endoscopic and 21 diagnostic naso endoscopic examinations were carried out. Also, 11878 new and 8865 repeat cases were examined and 121 major and 55 minor surgeries were successfully carried out at K.R.Hospital.



Specialized Clinical Services
The institute provided a variety of specialized clinical services for individuals with communication disorders at the following clinical units during the reporting year.

# Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) Unit:

Assessment and treatment were provided for 401 clients with autism spectrum disorders at the ASD unit during the reporting year. Of them, 69 were from Hindi region. The unit also attended 729 therapy and 86 demonstration therapy cases. Fifty seven therapy cases discharged during the period. The total number of therapy sessions conducted was 4031.

# Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) Unit:




Figure 3: AAC evaluation

The AAC unit supported, enhanced and provided alternative methods of communication for individuals who are non-verbal. The unit evaluated 37 new cases in 35 sessions and 346 therapy cases in 1481 sessions during the reporting year. It also attended 4 demonstration therapy, and trained 72 PG students in 139 sessions. The details of AAC evaluation are given in figure 3.

### Clinic for Adult and Elderly Persons with Language Disorders (CAEPLD):

CAEPLD provides clinical services to adult and elderly persons. Totally, 2 clients were evaluated in the clinic during the reporting year. The unit also attended 61 therapy cases in 237 sessions.



### **Fluency Unit:**

This unit caters to the needs of persons with stuttering and other fluency disorders and provided clinical services to 542 persons with fluency disorders in 3640 sessions during the reporting year.



### **Implantable Hearing Devices Unit:**

The activities of this unit include selection of candidates for cochlear implantation, mapping/ programming, trouble shooting of implantable hearing devices such as cochlear implant, bone anchored hearing aids and middle ear implants. During the reporting year, 138 clients were seen in the unit.



#### **Learning Disability Clinic:**

The learning disability clinic assessed 85 clients with learning disability in 122 sessions and 20 certificates were issued.



### **Listening Training (LT) Unit:**

Totally, 3018 persons underwent listening training in 10804 sessions during the reporting year.



### **Motor Speech Disorders Unit:**

This specialized unit caters to the needs of persons with motor speech disorders. It enables them to realize their potential and become contributing members of the society. Totally, there were 79 new clients for speech-language assessment and 80 for feeding assessment. The number of clients for intervention was 79.



### **Neuropsychology Unit:**

The services offered in the unit include assessment of specific function of the brain through standard individualized test, detailed assessment of lobular functions through standardized batteries and rehabilitation through paper pencil techniques or through computer assisted packages. Totally, 6 (35 sessions) neuropsychological assessments and 5 (44 sessions) neuropsychological rehabilitation were made during the reporting year in the unit.



### **Phonology Clinic:**

With the objective of developing appropriate evaluation and therapy materials for children and adults with phonological disorders in different languages, a Phonology Clinic was opened at the Institute on 28th December 2017. Totally, 24 clients with speech sound disorders were evaluated in the clinic during the reporting year. Also, 91 PG students were trained.



### **Professional Voice Care (PVC) Unit:**

The unit provided specialized assessment and management services to professional voice users during the reporting year. It organized various programs to orient and sensitize professional voice users on care, maintenance and conservation of voice. The unit evaluated 44 dients and provided therapeutic service to three clients during the reporting year. Also, 115 internship and II M.Sc. (SLP) students were provided specialized training in the assessment of voice of professional voice users in 886 hours.



# Structural Orofacial Anomalies (U-SOFA) Unit:

Clients with deformalities in the growth of head and facial bones were given multi-disciplinary diagnostic and rehabilitation services in the clinic. The experts of the clinic evaluated 220 clients in 1360 sessions during the reporting year.



### Swallowing Disorders Unit:

This unit facilitates assessment and management of persons with swallowing disorders. It evaluated 14 cases in 15 sessions during the reporting year. In addition, 14 clients underwent therapy in 32 sessions.



## Vertigo Clinic:

The clinic offered comprehensive care in evaluation and management of patients with vertigo. A multi-disciplinary beam comprising of audiologist, otolaryngologist and neurologist evaluated 227 patients in the clinic for both peripheral and central vertigo during the reporting year and diagnostic tests like microscopic examination of ear, electro nystagmography, vestibulo spinal tests, neurological evaluation, video nystagmography, audiological tests and vestibular evolute myogenic potential test were carried outfor the needy ones.



#### **Volce Clinic:**

This clinic offered evaluation and management services to persons of all ages with voice disorders. Totally, 398 clients with voice disorders were systematical in the clinic using video stroboscopy and software for voice assessment and rehabilitation services was provided for 1.75 clients.



#### Special Educational Services

The vertous educational services provided for mainstreaming children with special needs include Parent Infant Program for 403 clients in 1666 sessions. Perent Empowerment Program for 1029 dients in 2213 sessions, Preschool Training Program for 224 clients in 1872 sessions, Individualized Education Program for 97 clients in 419 sessions, Curricular Support Services for 306 clients in 1498 sessions, Non-Formal Education/ Demonstration Educational Training (DET) for 41. clients in 268 sessions, Guidance and Counseling for 391 clients in 372 mustions and Special Educational Assessment for 593 clients in 593 sersions. In addition, a one month surrener camp was organized for children with disability from 1st to 26" May, 2016 and 90 children attended the camp. A Chinnara Santhe was also set up as a part of the camp.



### Medical Specialty & Allied Health Services:




Figure 4: Modital specialty and effect houlds

The institute facilitated the services of various medical specialists such as pediatrician, neurologist, plastic surgeon, prosthodontist, orthodontist, phono-surgeon and services of allied health professionals such as physiotherapist and occupational therapist, to the needy clients. Totally, 1739 petients underwent occupational therapy in 9249 sessions and 631 underwent physiotherapy in 4677 sessions, during the reporting year. In addition, 730, 414, 218, 177, 54 clients consulted neurologist, pediatrician, plastic surgeon, phonosurgeon, ortho-dontist, respectively. The details are given in figure 4.

## **Clinical Support Services**

The institute extended a diverse range of support services to patients and their family. These include the following.

Distribution and Repairing of Aids: Electro-acoustic evaluation, management and repair of hearing aids were carried out under the aegis of Department of Electronics. Totally 774 hearing aids were distributed (566 hearing aids at the main campus and 208 hearing aids at clinical outreach centers), after electro-acoustic evaluation and testing under ADIP scheme. Under AIISH Hearing Aid Disparating Scheme, 1645 hearing aids were lessed at concessional rate. Aiso, 56005 hearing aid spares such as HA cells, cords, battery doors, ear hooks, body case and wind weather protector were issued. In addition, 454 body level and 660 BTE hearing aids were repaired, electronic-acoustic evaluation was carried out for 158 hearing aids and 17 audiometers were calibrated.

**Counseling and Guidence:** The professional experts of the Institute provided counseling and guidance on various aspects of the disorders such as treatment procedures, usage and care of tools like hearing side during the reporting year:


Distribution of toy kits: 164 toy kits were distributed to eligible disabled children worth 193,750.

# **OUTREACH SERVICES**

In addition to the diagnostic and therapeutic services provided within its walls, the institute carries out various outreach services on communication and its disorders in different parts of the country. The major outreach services carried out during the reporting year are given below.

#### **Communication Disorder Screening Programmes**

The Institute conducted screening programmes for communication disorders in different settings and localities. The individuals participating in the programmes were checked for speech, language and hearing abilities and provided with diagnostic and therapeutic services.

#### **Newborn / Infant Screening**

This programme focuses on screening neonates and infants who are at risk for communication disorders using various tools such as High Risk Register for communication disorders, Behavioral Observation Audiometry, Oto Acoustic Emission Screening and Screening Checklists. During the reporting year, screening programme was carried out at 19 hospitals and three immunization centres in Mysore, six Outreach Service Centres of the Institute functioning in different parts of Karnataka and six Newborn Screening Centres functioning in hospitals attached with the AIISH DHLS centres, at Sri RamachandraBhanj Medical College and Hospital (SCB MCH), Cuttack, Regional Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS), Imphal, Janana Hospital & JLNMCH, Ajmer, JIPMER, Puducherry, Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Medical College (NSCB), Jabalpur, Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences, Baritayu, Ranchi and a total of 29360 newborns were screened. Of these, 5880 babies (2%) were at risk for communication disorders. The details are given in table 1.

#### **Industrial Screening**

The institute conducts communication disorder screening activity at the industrial work settings. The employees working with the Government Printing Press, GRS Engineering Pvt Ltd., Hindustan Petroleum Pvt Ltd., Giri Stone Production, Mysure were screened for hearing loss and the needy cases were referred to the Institute for detailed evaluation. Employees and employers were oriented on harmful effects of noise on hearing, importance of hearing conservation program and also on the use of hearing protective devices in noisy areas. The details of industrial screening are given in table 3.

In addition, the industrial workers were encouraged to undergone hearing evaluation at the Institute clinic. Totally, 225 employees working with Karnataka State Industries Corporation, Govt. of Karnataka, Mysuru and Rane Madras Private Ltd., Mysuru availed clinical service at the Institute during the report year and 324 ears tested had hearing impairment.

#### **School Screening**

Nursery and primary school students from Mysore and Mandya were screened for communication disorder as a part of the school screening program during the reporting year. Totally, 2743 students were screened and among them 222 (8.09%) were identified with ear related disorders, 59 (2.15%) with hearing loss and 325 (12%) with speech-language disorders. They were recommended for follow-up at the Institute.



#### **Elderly Screening**

Speech, language and hearing evaluations were carried out for elderly citizens residing in different old age homes in Mysore. Totally, 101 elderly citizens were screened and among them 61 (60.39%) were identified with hearing disorders, 9 (6.91%) were identified with speech-language disorders, 8 (7.92%) were identified with multiple disorder. Also, hearing side were lesued to 7 elderly citizens.



#### Camp-based Screening

The Institute organized 10 camps in various localities across the state of Karnataka. The expert speech and hearing and elited health professionals of the institute screened 656 persons for communication disorders in the camps. The details are given in table 4. In addition, 3227 persons were evaluated for the disorders in 25 camps organized as a part of the survey on communication disorders. The details are given in table 8.

#### Clinical Services at the Outreach Service Centres

Diagnostic and therapeutic services on communication disorders were provided at the four Outreach Service Centres of the institute located in sub-divisional take hospital at Sagara takek,

Shivemage and the Primary Health Centres at Hullahalif, Mysuru, Alddhebbalu, Mandya and Segure. Totally, 2630 persons availed evaluation services, 99 persons underwent speech-language therapy and 46 hearing aids were distributed among the needy cases. The details of the evaluation and rahabilitation services provided at the outreach service centres are given in table 5 and 6 respectively.

#### **Tele-Intervention and Tele-Assessment Services**

Tele-assessment and tele-intervention services were offered to persons with communication disorders at the DHLS centres of the Institute located in different parts of the country through AIISH video conferencing system and 13 clients availed the service in 26 sessions. The Tele Centre for Persons with Communication Disorder (TCPD) also offered the tele-intervention and tele-assessment services through Skype, the popular web based communication tool and 48 clients availed the service in 1467 sessions.



#### **Etinerant Service**

The Institute offered itinerant service on prevention and control of communication disorders for the regular school children through the itinerant speech therepts and medical social worker. The service was provided at 18 schools (42 visits) and follow up activity was carried out for the 55 children identified with vertices types of communication disorders availing therepy at AIISH during the reporting year. Also, during the visit, 68 children with various types of communication disorders were newly identified and referred to the Institute and 130 baschers were oriented on prevention and control of communication disorders.

#### Survey of Persons with Communication Disorders

A survey of persons with communication disorders in the districts of Mysuru, Mandye and Chamarajanagara was going on with Dr. S.R. Savithri, Director, AIISH as the Principal Investigator and Dr. R. Manjula, Prof. of Speach Pethology, AIISH, Dr. R. Rejasuchelor, Lecturer in Speach Science, AIISH, Ms. Priya M.B., Lecturer in Speech Science and Dr. H. Sucharshan, Hon. Secretary, Karuna Trust as Co-Investigators. One auditory nume midwives, 88 Angarward trachers and 391 ASHA Workers performed the survey during the reporting year. Training was conducted for the

personnel deputed for carrying out the survey before mobilizing them to the villeges/tawns. Totally, six training programmes were organized in which 479 ASHA/ Anganwadī workers were trained. Totally 5,73,117 persons were surveyed in specific hobits of the three districts to identify persons with communication disorders. The details are given in table 7.



## **PUBLIC EDUCATION**

The institute has been taking various steps to make the common man aware of communication disorders, educate them on prevention of the disorders and provide guidance and counseling to persons suffering from such disorders. The major public education activities carried out during the reporting year are the following.

#### **Monthly Public Lectures**

In order to create public awareness on various communication disorders such as hearing aids-repair guidelines and care tips, peers in inclusive education, prevention of hearing loss, voice disorders, adaptation of a school lesson for children with hearing, dementia, tinnitus and classroom modifications for children with hearing impairment in the institute organized monthly public lectures tailored for common man, throughout the year, during which expert professionals working in the institute delivered one-hour lecture followed by question and answer session with the audience. Public Education on the prevention and control of communication disorders was also carried out through the print and electronic media. Some of the mass media based activities carried out during the reporting year are the following.





# OTHER ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS



## Infrastructure Development and Maintenance

The infrastructure development and maintenance activities of the institute are being carried out mainly by the Department of Electronics, and the Engineering and Horticulture sections.

### **Civil Engineering Infrastructure**

The institute spent Rs. 100.77 lakhs towards civil engineering infrastructure maintenance during the reporting year. The major work completed include construction of RCC retaining wall adjacent to diesel generator room at Panchavati campus, renovation of restrooms in new admin block, painting, construction of underground sump, providing UG drainage pipe line, fencing sandal wood trees, soundproofing treatment to rooms, providing ramp for differently-abled patients and providing and laying waterproofing treatment. In addition, construction of Centre of Excellence building worth ₹ 8600 lakhs was under progress.

### **Garden and Landscape Development**

The Horticulture section continued its effort to maintain and develop the garden areas and enhance the aesthetic appearances and eco-friendly atmosphere in the campus. The major works carried out include the ddevelopment of Bermuda lawn in the rose garden at a cost of Rs 2,18,400/- in an area of 625 sq.mtr, 500 indoor plants and 4500 flower pots for Dasara flower show exhibition. The section represented the institute in the Dasara Flower show 2016, organized by the Department of Horticulture, Government of Karnataka and in the flower show organized by the Mysore Palace Board and bagged prizes.



# **Implementing the Right to Information Act, 2005**

# **Library and Information Centre**

The major library and information services provided during the reporting year include the following.

**Acquisition of Information Resources:** Totally 445 print books were purchased during the reporting year making the total collection to 21396. In addition, 115 national / international journals both in print and electronic format and two online databases were subscribed, and 92 research reports were added to the in-house digital repository. The institute received 242 nos. of medical Journals as a part of ERMED consortium of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India and more than 90,000 e-books and 3000 e-journals as a part of N-LIST service of the Information and Library Network, University Grants Commission, Govt. of India.



**Information Services Offered:** The various information services provided include book lending, reference, Internet, online public access catalogue, web portal based services, CD-ROMs, online databases, e-books, plagiarism detection, remote login, bibliographic management, language laboratory, newspaper clipping, digital repository and VPN based resource access to the DHLS centers.

**Orientation/Training Programs:** The newly admitted students were oriented on various library resources and on information literacy. Training was also given on Turnitin, the anti-plagiarism software.

**Open Elective Course:** An Open Elective Course on Information Management in Speech. Language and Hearing was offered for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester PG programmes under University of Mysore, Mysuru.



# **Product Development and Distribution**

Totally, 864 nos. of Institute publications were sold under the aegis of the Product Development Cell generating an amount of ₹302655.



### **Material Development Activities**

The Department of Material Development carried out the creation of various materials for the public on prevention, identification and management of communication disorders. To cater to individuals from different linguistic backgrounds, materials were developed in different Indian languages in print, audio and video formats. In addition, the Department was also involved in producing materials on various rights and welfare measures available for individuals with communication disorders, design and printing of invitation cards for Institute events and the certificates issued for various purposes. # Personnel Management

## **Reservation Policy Implementation**


