# (1) Cases of hysterectomy should also be brought under the purview of the orders because a woman who undergoes hysterectomy on medical grounds automatically gets sterilised.

- (3) Will the persons who have undergone sterili- no sation before the date in of issue of the orders for and have undergone in sterilisation again after the date of issue of the orders because the earlier operation turned our to be a failure should be eligible for the incentive.

The special increment may be allowed in all cases of sterilisation where the couple had twins after the birth of their first two children although the number of children becomes four.

No. Such persons will not be eligible for the incentive as the action for sterilisation was initiated prior to the issue of the orders.

. (4) Will the persons who undergo vassctomy and who have three children but whose wives were premant at the time of the vasectomy operation be eligible for the incentive.

(5) Whether before granting the special increment in the case of a vasectomy case, sperm count should be insisted upon.

(6) Whether in case of recanalisation) the special increment should be withdrawn. No. In fact there is a a need to prescribe a standard form of undertaking/certificate that a person claiming the incentive should furnish to exclude such cases.

The authorities issuing the sterilisation certificate are expected to satisfy themselves about the complete absence of sperms before issue of the certificate. The standard format of the certificate required to be issued for this purpose is enclosed.

In such cases the special increment may be withdrawn from the date of recanalisation.

In order to make the decisions taken in respect of the items (4), (5) and (6) above effective and to secure an undertaking from the Central Government employees claiming the incentives the enclosed standard formats have been prescribed,

In so far as persons serving in the Indian Audit & Accounts Department are concerned, these clarifications are issued in consultation with the C&A. G. of India.
