


Figure 1: Different target groups oriented in the academic year 2014-15

#### About the program:

The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India has launched the Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK), Child Health Screening and Early Intervention Services under the National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) in the country. In order to update the knowledge of the professionals of Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists, the All India Institute of Speech and Hearing conducted 10 days refresher course on "National Consultation of Speech Pathologists and Audiologists". The objective of the workshop was to facilitate training and learning by professionals for use of certain standard protocols in terms of prevention, early identification and intervention of communication disorders in children that could be used at the District Early Intervention Centre (DEIC) established by the GoI. During the training process, the professionals were updated with the importance of case history taking, screening, diagnostic procedures, report writing, prevention & early identification of communication disorders, calibration of equipment and guidelines to

decisions for management of communication disorders.

The Department of PoCD initiated three New Born Screening center's at Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Medical College (NSCB), Jabalpur, The Jawaharlal Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research (JIPMER), Puducherry, Dr. Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences, Ranchi and Outreach Service Centre (OSC) at Subdivisional Taluk Hospital, Sagara. The new staff members (Speech-Language Pathologist/Audiologist & Speech and Hearing Assistant) were recruited for these centres. The training program was spaced to 05 days to train the newly recruited staff members to update their knowledge on various screening, diagnostic and rehabilitation aspects on communication disorders.

#### (i) Follow-up evaluation

The newborns/infants referred during the newborn screening were followed up through telephone calls to parents/caregivers of infants. A complete test battery was administered for those clients who came for follow-up. Table 7 depicts the statistics related to this activity.




Figure 2: Results of the newborns and infants during the follow-up evaluation.

#### ii) Hearing evaluation of industrial workers:

Employees from different industries had undergone hearing evaluation at AIISH. A total of 245 employees had registered in the report year. Out of them, 282 ears had identified as hearing impairment on administration of complete audiological test battery. All the registered employees were counseled regarding the importance of hearing protection devices and its need to use regularly in noisy conditions to protect their hearing ability. The details of the hearing evaluation of the employees are represented in Table 8.




Figure 3: Details of the Industrial employees identified as having hearing impairment

#### **B)** Prevention of Communication Disorders

The department of PoCD is actively involved in carrying out various extension activities such as screening, diagnostic and rehabilitation services outside the institute campus. The activities include newborn/infant screening, screening of school children, screening of elderly citizens, screening of industrial workers, conducting camps and also clinical services offered at the outreach service centers of AIISH. Apart from that, the department is extensively involved in offering clinical services within the institute who were identified at-risk for communication disorders in the screening program and were referred to the institute for further detailed evaluation. The details of the various programs for the report year were as follows.

#### 1. New born/Infant screening

This program is focused on screening the newborns and infants who are at-risk for communication disorders. All the newborns delivered at the hospitals and the infants at the immunization centres were screened using specific protocol including High Risk Register for communication disorders, Behavioral Observation Audiometry (BOA), Oto Acoustic Emission screening (OAE), Primitive reflexes, and developmental Screening Checklists.

Also, the parents and care givers were counseled on normal developmental milestones of speech, language and hearing aspects of the child. Developmental checklist was given to the parents/ caregivers to monitor the developmental milestones of their babies/children. If any delay or deviancies were observed, they were advised to consult the professionals immediately. Identified at-risk newborns were given referral card for detailed evaluation at AIISH within a month

Currently, the screening program is carried out in 15 hospitals and 3 Immunization centers within Mysore; 03 NBS centers in the northern states of India; 03 sub-divisional taluk hospitals, 02 community health centers and 01 primary health centers within Karnataka. The details of the number of newborns and infants screened for communication disorders are given in table 9.




Figure 4: Details of the Newborns/infants screened and referred




Figure 5: Screening school children for communication disorders

#### 3. Hearing screening of Industrial employees

Screening of industrial employees was regularly conducted as part of the hearing conservation program in various industries. It majorly focused on identifying the employees who were at-risk for hearing loss and refer those employees for detailed hearing evaluation at the institute. Also, employees were sensitized during the screening program regarding the harmful effects of noise and the importance of using hearing protection devices in noisy conditions. A total of 119 employees from Karnataka Silk Industries Pvt. Ltd., Mysuru were screened in the report year and the details are depicted in graph 11.





Figure 6: Screening results of Industrial employees.

The elderly individuals may show a gradual decline in their hearing, cognition, speech and language abilities due to aging or any other conditions such as stroke (CVA), Alzheimer's disease, Parkinson's disease, etc. This program is regularly conducted to facilitate identification and rehabilitation of any form of communication disorders in the elderly individuals. Clinical services were offered at various old-age homes in terms of identification of communication disorders, rehabilitation through speech and language therapy, guidance and distribution of free body level hearing aids. A total of 170 elderly citizens were screened for communication disorders and the details are tabulated below in table 12.




Figure 7: Screening Elderly citizens for communication disorders

#### **5.** Clinical Services at Outreach Service Centers (OSCs):

The clinical activities are not only restricted to in and around Mysore, but also extended to rural areas where facilities for clinical services for persons with communication disorders were meager. Currently 04 OSCs (01 sub-divisional taluk hospital at Sagara taluk, Shivamogga District; 03 Primary Health Centre - PHC at Hullahalli, Mysuru district; Akkihebbalu, Mandya district & Karuna trust, Gumballi, Chamarajanagara district) were initiated to meet the objective of extending the services of the institute to rural areas. The OSCs are functioning as a well-equipped unit for screening, diagnostics and therapeutic services for persons with communication disorders. The services include screening, diagnostic and rehabilitation which includes newborn/infant screening, screening of school children, Speech and Language evaluation, Audiological evaluation, ENT evaluation, Speech-Language therapy, issue of free body level hearing aids and ear molds, and counseling and guidance to individuals with communication disorders.

In the current year, a total of 2111 individuals had availed the OSC services. The other details are tabulated below in tables 13 & 14.




Figure 8: Clinical Evaluation services at OSCs (HH-Hullahalli, AK-Akkihebbalu, GB-Gumballi)




Figure 9: Clinical Rehabilitation services at OSCs (HH-Hullahalli, AK-Akkihebbalu, GB-Gumballi)





Figure 10: Clinical Evaluation services at Camps

#### 1. Rally and Moving Tableau for Noise awareness

Department of PoCD and NSS jointly conducted Moving Tableau and rally on 18.10.2014 to mark the harmful effects of noise during celebration of Diwali festival. The objective of the rally was to spread awareness through slogans, handouts, pamphlets and moving tableau on the harmful effects of noise while bursting crackers, its ill effects and guidelines for its control.






