Page (webpage) Quickstart Guide

The Page resource enables lecturers to create a web page resource using the text editor. A page can display text, images, sound, video, web links and embedded code, such as Google maps. Advantages of using the page module rather than the file module include the resource being more accessible (for example to users of mobile devices) and easier to update.

A page may be used;

- To present a concept to students
- To present a summary of the module
- To embed several videos or sound files together with some explanation
- For large amounts of content, it's recommended that a book is used rather than a page.

Do not copy and paste your text directly from Microsoft Word, websites or email into the ATTO text editor on the Moodle page. This can introduce some bad code and break your module or make the text inaccessible for students. To paste your text into a Moodle page you need to remove the formatting by copying the text into Notepad. Once copied into Notepad you can copy paste the text into the ATTO text editor.

Opening Notepad

In the Windows search box, type Notepad, and then, in the list of results, click Notepad.
