## Using copyright material

Under the Copyright Act, you do not need to ask for permission to use copyright material if:

- You <u>own the copyright</u> in the work.
- <u>The University of Melbourne owns the copyright</u>, you are a University staff member who wishes to use the material for University of Melbourne teaching or business purposes. If you wish to use the material for non-University purposes, see <u>requesting permission to use</u> <u>University of Melbourne copyright material</u>.
- Copyright in the work has expired.
- You are copying or communicating an *insubstantial portion*.
- You have an express <u>licence</u> or <u>permission</u> to use the work, e.g. a contract, website conditions, copyright owner has explicitly waived copyright, etc.
- Your proposed use is an instance of <u>fair dealing</u>. You must observe the limits and rules under the fair dealing provisions. Fair dealing may include research and study, providing access by a person with a disability, criticism and review, and parody and satire.
- Your use is for the <u>educational purposes</u> of the University as described in the <u>Statutory Licence</u> provisions. University staff rely on the Statutory Licence provisions to reproduce or communicate course material to students.
- You are copying recorded music for educational purposes or performing music for educational purposes or at a University event as covered by the <u>music licence</u>.
- You are reproducing the material for your personal use and you observe the limits and rules under the <u>personal use provisions.</u>
- You are reproducing material in an accessible format to assist a student with a disability
- You are a University Library or Archives staff member and you are reproducing copyright material held in the library collection for Preservation purposes or other library purposes.
- Your proposed use fits the definition of a "certain special purposes" under s200AB, as advised by the Copyright Office. For more information <u>contact the Copyright Office</u>.

You must always acknowledge any material that you use.
